




## HOW TO GET TO CAMP ERRINUNDRA

Get on the M1 freeway and just keep heading east, it will turn into the A1 and you will go through Sale, Bairnsdale, and Lakes Entrance. Turn left off the highway into the town of Orbost (**this is the last stop for food and petrol, there are no shops in Goongerah so make sure you fill up before heading out**).

Head north on the Bonang Road for about an hour until you pass through Goongerah. Keep following the Bonang, the road will turn to gravel for a while. Take a right hand turn onto the Bendoc-Orbost (Gap) road, there are signs for the Errinundra National Park. Continue for some time past signs to the old growth forest walk, then turn left on Playgrounds track. Continue along this road for another 8km. You will see us camped there, there will be lots of cars and a banner over the road.





## WHAT TO EXPECT

The Errinundra Camp is supporting protests and non-violent direct action. The camp is outside the illegal zone. Walks and spotlight tours can be on unmarked tracks through the forest and require some level of fitness.

There is a first aid kit at camp, there have been snakes seen in the area. There will be a safety and OH&S induction on the Saturday morning.

There is hand sanitiser available, please bring a mask and practice COVID safety.

## WHAT TO BRING

We have a communal camp kitchen set up and lots of food, but please be as self-sufficient as possible. We have a communal fire pit, if you can bring firewood to contribute that would be great.

There are lots of places to camp, please be wary about setting up underneath trees, making sure you are not camping under any dead branches.

Bring lots of warm clothes and wet weather gear, even in the Spring and Summer months it can be cold and wet. Bring food, water, gas bottles/cookers and prepare to be self-sufficient.

There is some phone reception at camp.

Bring water bottles, day packs, head torches, spare batteries, spotlights, and cameras if you have them, and any survey equipment if you have survey gear (if not no worries we have plenty of gear, but it's great if you can bring your own). If you have experience tree climbing bringing climb gear out is also useful.

Sturdy hiking shoes, sun hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and heaps of snacks for day trips etc.

**Remember: there are no shops or petrol between Orbost and Delegate.** You need to bring everything you need, last stop for food, fuel and reception before reaching camp is in Orbost.
