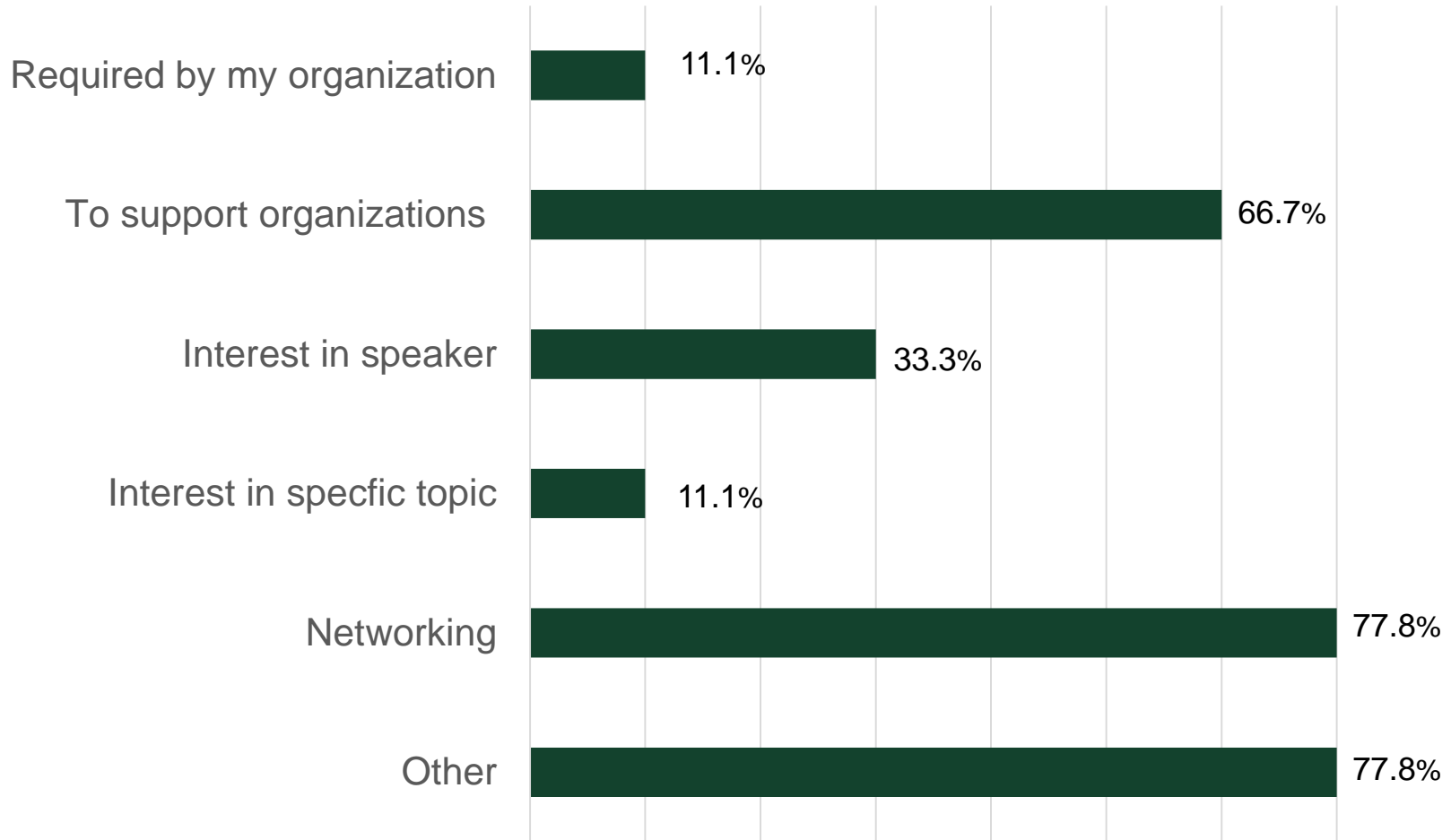

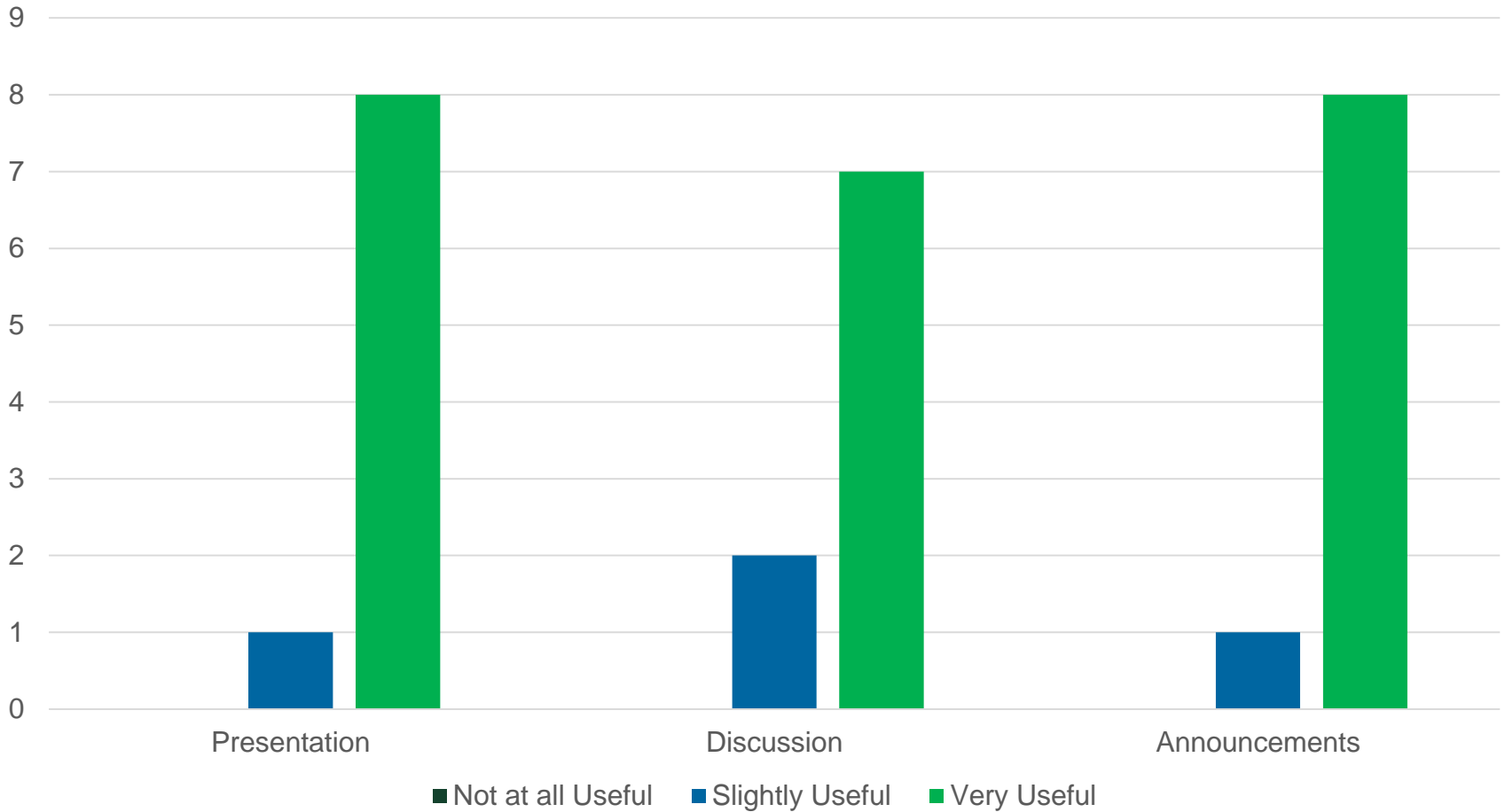

Usefulness of Meeting Format

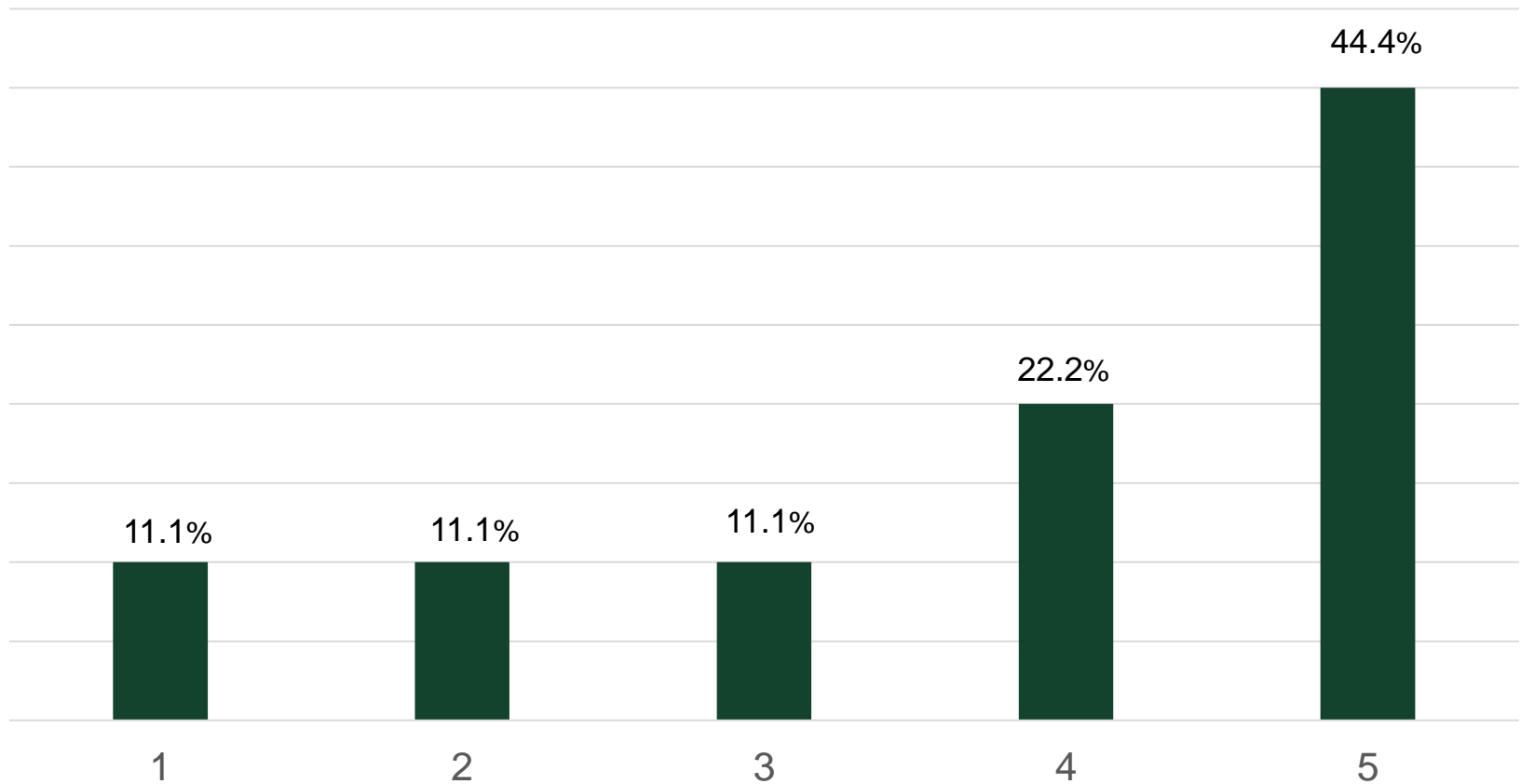

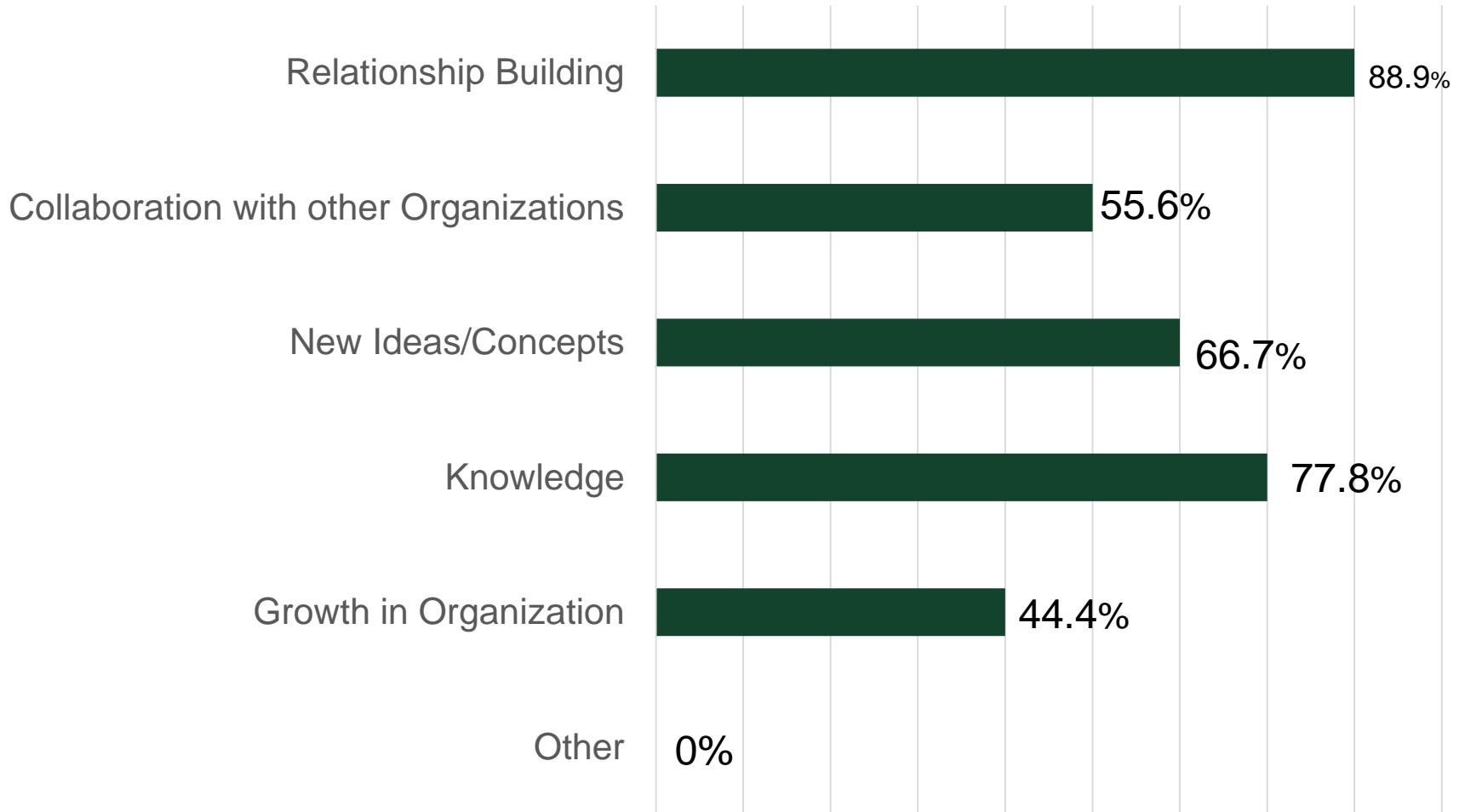
Comments

- No. I have only attended one meeting thus far.

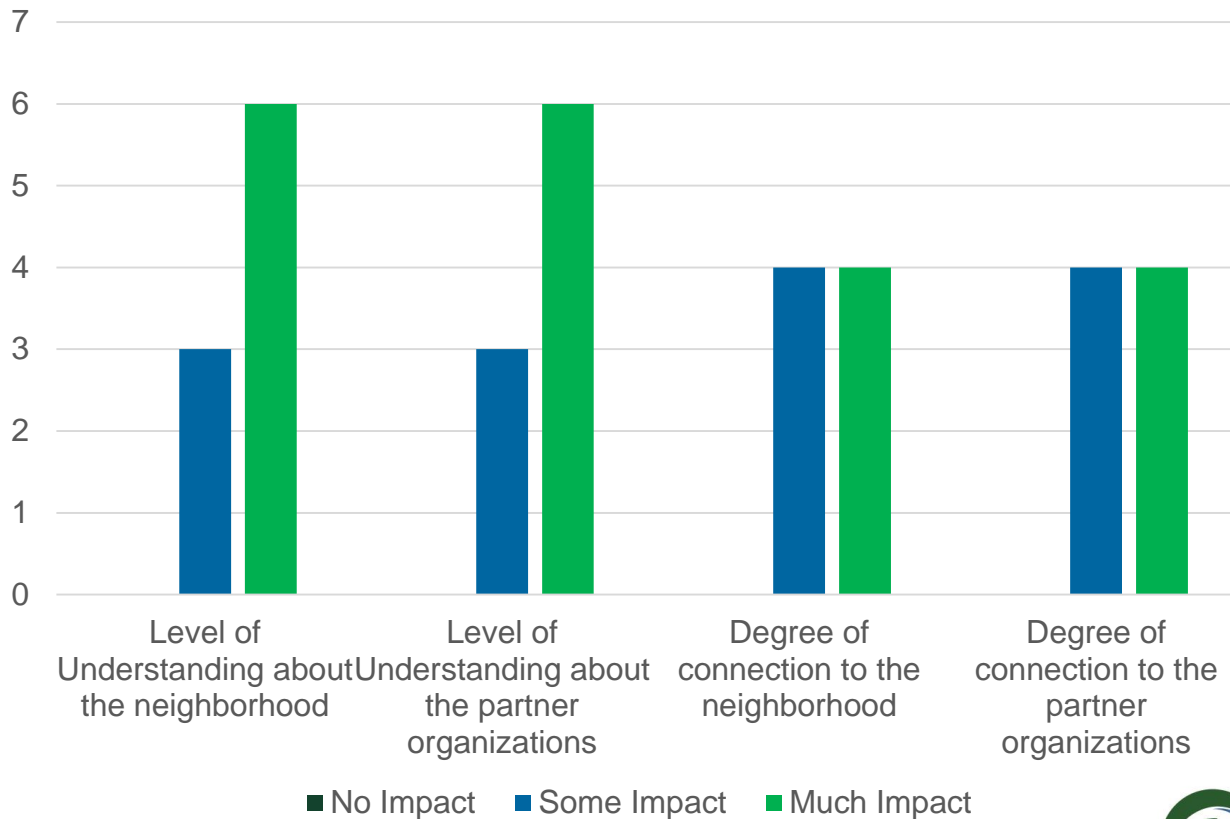
Ability to Network, Build Relationships, Share Ideas with Peers

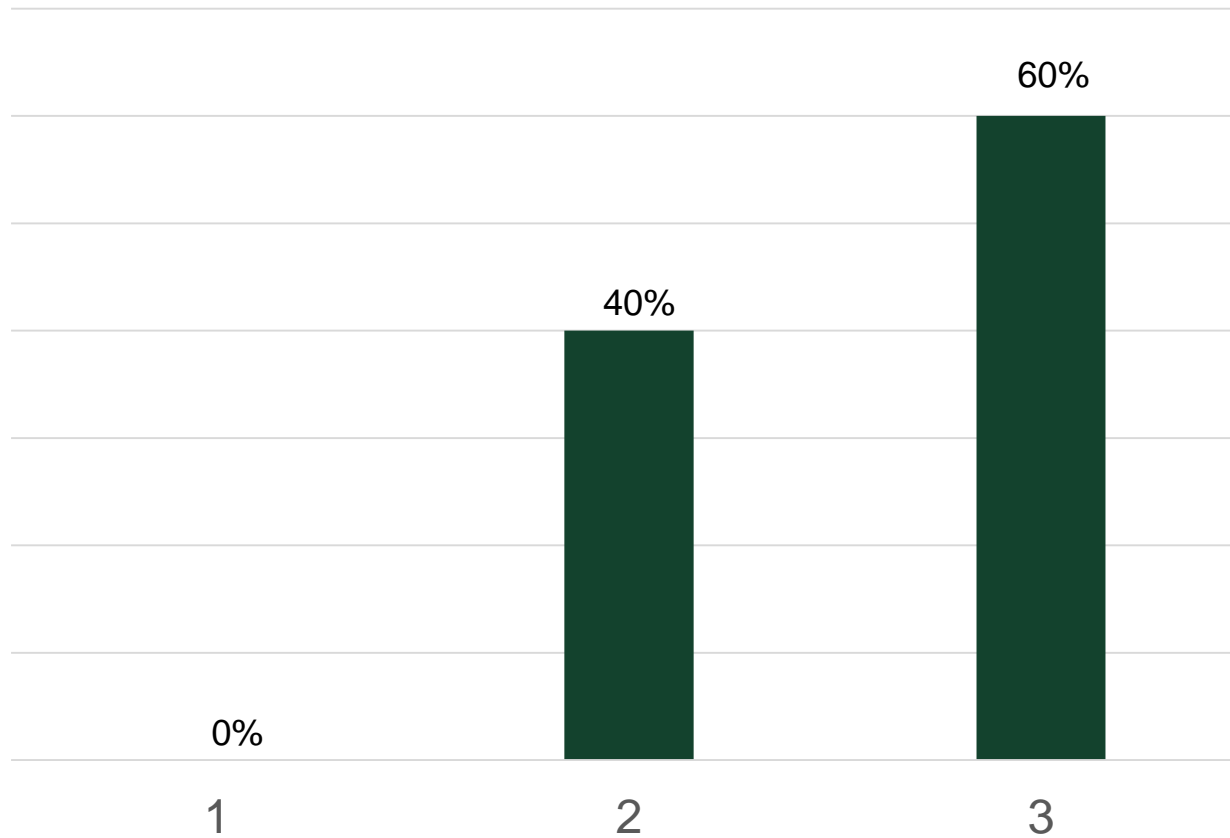

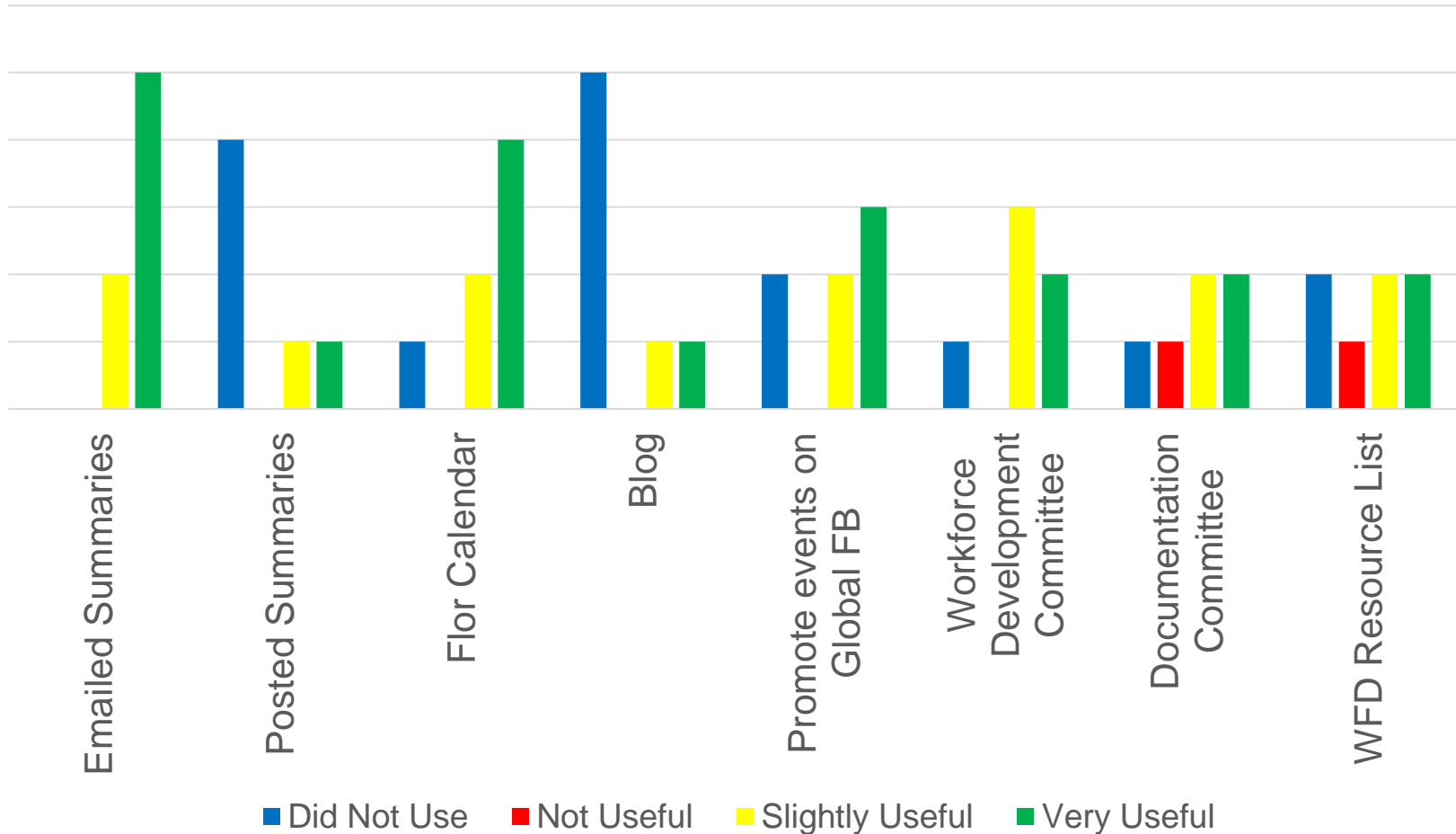
