Green Party Presidential Caucus

The Green Party of Pennsylvania (GPPA) sends you this newsletter because you are an active Registered Green Party Voter. As a minor party, the state does not allow us to have a Primary. Thus, in order to determine who are candidates will be, we will be holding caucuses across the state.

We invite you to participate in our upcoming caucus to help determine who, if anyone, will be our 2008 Green Party Presidential Candidate. Please see the schedule in this newsletter that shows when your local Green Party caucus will occur, sometime in late April and early May.

What if my county doesn't have a caucus or the date is inconvenient for me?

If you live in a county that does not have a caucus, or if the scheduled date is inconvenient, you may opt to participate in a caucus of a nearby county.

Will there be absentee ballots?

There are no provisions for absentee voting.

What is a caucus? How does it work?

A caucus is a meeting at which registered Green voters discuss the options for Presidential nominee and then vote on who the nominee should be. These votes are used by GPPA to determine how (and whether) GPPA delegates to the Green Party of the United States (GPUS) nominating convention in July, in Chicago, should vote

The caucuses will consist of some discussion, after which each caucus attendee will indicate their Green Party Presidential nominee preferences in rank order. The principal options are listed below. The caucus is not limited to these options.

Each attendee will also be asked whether the GPPA should support the GPUS candidate, as we usually do, in which case the preferences will determine how our GPPA delegation votes at the GPUS nominating convention in Chicago, July 10-13, or conversely, whether GPPA should forego the GPUS nomination process and instead support the winner of the GPPA caucus.

Do I have to have backup choices and rank order my preferences?

No. You must vote for at least one preference (e.g. a candidate, 'No Candidate', Uncommitted, etc.). You may list as many or few additional choices (2nd, 3rd, etc) as you desire.

Born 1959, in West Virginia. Attended North Carolina School for the Arts, and Marshall University. Worked on a seismographic ship, as an actor, stage producer, stand-up comic and country line dance instructor. Ran for Governor of WV in 2002, and US Senate in 2006.

Named by Time Magazine as one of the 100 Most Influential Americans in the Twentieth Century, his efforts have helped to create a framework of laws, regulatory agencies, and federal standards that have improved the quality of life for two generations of Americans. AB magna cum laude from Woodrow Wilson School of International Affairs, Princeton University; LLB from Harvard Law School. Presidential candidate of the Green Party in 2000 and independent Presidential candidate in 2004.

Nader is not seeking the Green Party nomination in 2008. He has chosen to seek ballot access in Pennsylvania with the "Populist Party" slogan. Included as a candidate here because many Greens support his candidacy despite his not running as a Green. (continued on page 3)

Counties not currently planning a caucus: Beaver, Bradford, Bucks, Cameron, Carbon, Chester, Clearfield, Clinton, Elk, Forest, Fulton, Greene, Juniata, McKean, Lebanon, Mifflin, Pike, Potter, Somerset, Sullivan, Tioga, Warren, Washington. Greens in these counties can attend whatever caucus may be closest to them, and can check the www.gpofpa.org website caucus schedule in case plans change for their county or a nearby county.

Other Presidential Options (cont'd)

No Candidate

Caucus attendees may vote 'No Candidate' as one of their preferences, supporting the idea that GPUS (or GPPA) ought not to run any Presidential candidate.

Uncommitted

Caucus attendees may vote 'Uncommitted' as one of their preferences, supporting the idea that the GPPA delegation to GPUS should be allowed flexibility to vote in whatever way they deem best at the nomination convention in Chicago in July.
