Results of the Green Party Primaries

The presidential nominee of the Green Party will be determined at its Presidential Nominating Convention (PNC) to be held on July 11, 2020. On the first ballot, most delegates voting at the PNC are required to vote for candidates assigned to them according to results of the various primaries and conventions. The criteria for official recognition can be found in [Article 10](#) of the Green Party Rules and Procedures.

The PCSC has recommended that all officially recognized candidates be placed on state primary ballots and be allowed to participate fully in state primary processes. Other candidates may be included at the discretion of the state parties.

Other Declared Candidates

The table below lists certain other persons who have submitted a Letter of Interest to the PCSC and whom the PCSC believes are active at some level. Some of these candidates may qualify for official recognition in the future. The appearance of a candidate in these tables does not imply any Green Party endorsement or approval of their campaign or their campaign positions nor does it imply that their level of activity is consistent with a genuine campaign for the nomination.

Notes:

[1] Receipts according to data published on the FEC website as of 5/29/20. First number is total of individual donations and is most applicable to qualifying for official recognition. Number in parentheses is total receipts including self-funding, PAC donations, and loans. If no funds are shown here, the candidate has not yet filed a campaign finance report with the FEC. Reporting is not required if less than \$5000 has been raised.

[2] Validated signatures collected under the Article 10 signature collection process as of 3/31/20. A candidate must collect 100 signatures to qualify for official recognition. Note that this is not a poll. Most candidates stop soliciting signatures when they exceed the required 100 signatures.

[3] FEC Form 1 has been filed for 2020, thus creating an FEC-recognized campaign committee to accept donations and report to the FEC. This committee must have been formed to qualify for official recognition.
