Q1 Did you receive an official voter registration notice in the mail?

Ok. Keep an eye out for it just in case one comes in the mail. If you get one, make sure to respond before July 15. [Go to Q4]

[Not sure]

Ok. Keep an eye out for it just in case it comes in the mail. If you get one, make sure to respond before July 15. It might also be worth giving your clerk a call to see if you're affected. [Go to Q3]

Q2 Have you sent back the attached response postcard so you can stay registered to vote?

[Yes]

That's great! Thank you so much for your time.

[No]

That's ok. You still have a little time to return it. Just be sure to put in the mail before July 15 to stay registered. [Go to Q3]

Q3 Do you have any questions about the mailing or how to respond?

[Yes]

(Answer their questions - info is available [here](#)) Thank them for their time.

[No]

Thank you for your time.

Q4 Are you registered to vote at your current address?

[Yes]

Ok great! [Go to Q3]

[No]

That's ok. It's important to update your registration information to make sure you don't run into any issues next time you try to vote. You can update your registration online at myvote.wi.gov.
[Go to Q5]

[Not sure]

That's ok. You can check your registration online at myvote.wi.gov. [go to Q5]

Q5 Would you like an email with the link?

[Yes]

Ask for their email address and write it down. We'll send you the link soon. Thank you for your time!

[No]

Ok. Thank you for your time.
