WITNEY'S CHILDREN NEED CLEAN AIR

Health suffers as Witney awaits air quality action

West Oxfordshire District Council declared Bridge Street and surrounding junctions an "Air Quality Management Area" in 2005 - **but no action has been taken.**

The area has one of the highest levels of air pollution in the country. **Air pollution is a contributing factor in 1 in 20 deaths in Oxfordshire** – mostly in people with heart or lung disease. In children, pollution can **prevent the lungs from developing properly and worsens asthma.** In pregnancy, it is linked to problems such as pre-term birth.

Green Councillor Andrew Prosser said, "Whether you're in a car or walking through the area, you're breathing toxic air, especially during rush hour. **Adding 1400 new homes in North Witney will only increase the problem.** It's a serious health issue and needs radical changes."

In February, Andrew spoke at a public meeting on air quality, organised by the Green Party at the Witney Corn Exchange. Since then **he has been pressing the District Council to come up with an air quality action plan** to address the problems of traffic pollution in the town.

WITNEY NORTH ELECTS FIRST GREEN

Andrew Prosser elected to Witney Town Council

In May 2019, **Councillor Andrew Prosser was elected** for Witney North with 658 votes (the highest vote share of any candidate).

The first Green on the Town Council since 2009, Andrew now sits on the Planning and Development Committee, where he is already making changes. His proposal to **improve bus stops by adding cycle racks and recycling bins** was welcomed and developer funding has been found for two of the new bus stops so far.

On 6 June, **Andrew represented Witney North residents at the wreath laying** at the war memorial on Church Green to mark the 75th Anniversary of the D-Day Landings.

Andrew also attended the Witney Community Primary School summer fête, where he spoke to the Head Teacher and the Chair of the Friends of WCPS about **how the Council could better support the school.**

COUNCILS DECLARE CLIMATE EMERGENCY

District and Town Councils commit to climate action



West Oxfordshire District Council and Witney Town Council have **declared a climate emergency** after receiving a petition from local residents – including many Green Party members – on 26 June.

The Town Council committed to help the area **become carbon neutral by 2028**.

Councillor Andrew Prosser said, “We must now **urgently develop an action plan** to slash climate emissions - by **improving housing, installing solar panels and encouraging a mass shift to cleaner, greener transport.**”

COMMUNITY BUSES

More than just transport

In July 2016, Oxfordshire County Council scrapped all bus subsidies. More than 50 services stopped the next day, and bus companies have continued to cut more and more routes since.

Green Party campaigner **Andrew Lyon** is among a small group of dedicated people who have **stepped in, setting up West Oxfordshire Community Transport (WOCT)**, where Andrew is Head of Operations. WOCT is a not-for-profit, community-owned bus operator; it runs the **213 and 214 routes, which serve north Witney** at half hourly intervals in the morning and hourly up to 17:20 in the afternoon.

“Many of the routes are a vital lifeline for those with no other way to get around,” Andrew explains. “The bus for so many is more than just transport, it's a kind of social club atmosphere. Many people would be lost without it.”
