- 2) If you are running for College Board, tell us about what you have done to support CCSF during its accreditation crisis and what you plan to do to keep it open and funded. Even if you aren't running for College Board, if you have been a part of the fight to save CCSF, feel free to tell us about what you have done to help.
- 3) Do you support repeal or reform of the Ellis Act? Locally, what specifically would you do to fight for housing affordability in San Francisco?
 - I support reform of the Ellis Act. While the concept on paper may seem valid, it is now being exploited and in many is having the reverse effect of its intended use.
 - While there may instances where families due to personal circumstances may need to take property off the rental market so they can all live together, clearly use of the Ellis Act has morphed into something which now is being abused by real estate developers to draw more high end tenants at the expense of working San Franciscans. We need to study how we make the Ellis Act more specific to families who need the space for their families.
- 4) In your opinion, what kind of reform of Prop 13 is needed, if any? Would you support a split-roll property tax system?
 - Massive reform of Prop 13 is needed. Clearly the large commercial property owners, those who can afford a heavier tax burden, are enjoying the same benefits as the small homeowners. But as society changes and social needs become more pronounced, the inequity of Prop 13 becomes more glaring.
 - I would support a split = roll system.
- 5) LGBTQ elders and older people living with HIV face a number of challenges, including finding affordable housing, accessing health care and a general lack of services. Many are being evicted. If you were elected, what would you do in your power to help address these challenges?
 - BART already offers a 62 percent discount on its fares (the highest in the Bay Area) to seniors. We also have programs which assist disabled and infirmed passengers.
 - I will continue these types of efforts so that BART becomes even more accessible to elderly HIV citizens.
- 6) Similarly, LGBTQ youth face challenges including bullying and a high rate of homelessness if ostracized by their families. If you are elected, what would you do in your power to help these youth? For School Board candidates, what would you do on the SFUSD board to help LGBTQ students who are bullied?
 - The entire BART staff (including our police department) has a no tolerance policy towards bullying of any kind, youth, elderly etc... As early as 2009 BART had an art exhibit by youth which not only demonstrated their talent but emphasized that those

being bullied should seek out immediate assistance. In addition the BART police have a program (GRAPE) in which go to middle schools and provide assistance and support to youth who feel they might be victims of bullying (more toward gangs).

At the BART workplace, our code of conduct touches on bullying, but I believe we need to make it much more forceful.

I will explore how we can integrate and implement programs that deal with LGBTQ youth and seniors who are the victims of bullying.

7) Supervised injection facilities or drug consumption facilities have been shown to reduce new HIV and hepatitis infections, overdose deaths, and public drug use, and to increase linkage to medical care and substance use treatment and save money, yet they remain controversial and illegal. If you are elected, what would you do to advocate for supervised injection sites?
