



Field Trip Opportunity:

Tours are available for grade levels 4th through 12th and classes may apply for one trip per school year. If you are interested in scheduling a field trip opportunity, you must submit an application request form.

Field Trip Sites (paid trip includes a visit to 2 sites):

DWP Wastewater Treatment Plant 1

Located in the City of Corona, DWP provides a tour of the Wastewater Treatment Plant led by the plant operators themselves! This tour allows students to walk through the different steps of treating reclaimed water so that it can be reused throughout the City. In addition the tour will educate students on how to distinguish between potable and reclaimed water.

Prado Wetlands

An environmental expert guides the class on a 3 mile walk through the wetlands. During the tour, students can expect to see birds such as herons, egrets, raptors, screech owls and warblers to name a few. The Prado Wetlands tour includes water testing, planting, a talk about birds, a nature walk, and a presentation.

Tin Mine Canyon

Located on Skyline Drive off of West Foothill Parkway, the Tin Mine Canyon site includes a hiking trail where students can measure biodiversity and then end the hike at a creek where students learn about water quality and get to test water samples that they collect themselves.

You request the trip, and we'll do the rest!

The City of Corona Department of Water and Power (DWP), Inland Empire Waterkeeper and US Forestry Trabuco District Will work with the teachers to select the location of the trip as well as provide the necessary field equipment required for the tour locations. We are flexible and desire to build this experience around the teacher's needs.



The program is available on a first come first serve basis. Tours are only available for schools within DWP service areas and are offered for grade levels 4th through 12th.
