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Clean Water Act Fee

Required by a Federal government mandate, the Watershed Protection and Restoration Program instructs Maryland's nine largest counties and the City of Baltimore to establish a funding plan to pay for stormwater improvements.



Funding

Funds will be used solely to treat impervious surfaces, addressing stormwater runoff pollution from impervious areas such as rooftops, sidewalks, driveways, roadways, and parking lots.

 Reduce all or a portion of the impact fees in exchange for implementing on-site and offsite systems, facilities, services, or activities that reduce the quantity or improve the quality of storm water discharged from their property



- Is an CWA fee assessed to properties?
- Is the fee correct?
- Admin Fee 20.58 per Tax account + Impact Fee 20.90 per ESU ~ 1 ESU = 2,065 sf of impervious area
- Only Centers of Worship and 501(c) nonprofit organizations can reduce their fees through an "Alternative Compliance Program"
- Fee reduction applies only to Impervious Area portion of CWAF (the administrative fees still apply = \$20.58 per tax account per year)
- Application to Prince George's County DoE is required



☐ Option 1: Provide Easement – (50% fee reduction)

Property owner agrees to provide to the County a <u>Temporary Right-of-Entry Agreement</u> and <u>Temporary Construction Easement</u> for the County to install stormwater best management practices (BMPs) on the property owned by the organization.

AND

To continue receiving the 50% impervious area fee reduction credit, property owner is required to sign a <u>Maintenance Agreement</u> and continuously maintain the installed BMPs which are subjected to a tri-annual inspection by the Department of the Environment.





<u>Option 2: Outreach and Education – (25% fee reduction)</u>

Property owner agrees to take part in the County's education and outreach campaign to encourage other property owners as well as members of their organization to participate in the County's <u>Rain Check Rebate Program</u> to contribute toward the restoration and protection of the County watersheds.

AND/OR

Property owner agrees to host County's representative to organize and/or conduct annually one (1) of the following activities.

- ☐On-site trash Pick-up event
- □On-site recycling and better waste management
- ☐ Host a Rain Check Rebate Program
- □Plant at least five (5) trees on site (trees provided through the county "Rain Check Program")

Rain Check Rebate Program







Applicant Eligibility

Eligible Applicants include:

- Homeowners
- Members of a housing cooperative
- Commercial businesses
- Multi-family dwellings
- Nonprofit organizations
- Not-for-profit organizations







Project Eligibility

- Project must be located within Prince George's County
- Project must be completed within 12 months of application approval
- ◆ It can not be part of the permit approval requirements for new building construction or renovations.
- Pre-approval is required for all practices (except rain barrels) and installation must be consistent with DER guidelines
- The project follows the program guidelines and criteria



Tree Releaf Rebate Program

The ReLeaf program provides funding for

communities to plant trees to restore our urban tree canopy.











□ Option 3: Green Care and Good Housekeeping - (25% fee reduction)

Property owner agrees to use lawn management companies* that are certified in the proper use and application of fertilizers in connection with their landscaping and lawns.

* <u>Companies must be listed in the Maryland Department of Agriculture's searchable pesticide database under the appropriate license category</u> (http://www.kellysolutions.com/md/pesticideindex.htm)

AND/OR

Property owner agrees to good house-keeping practices for ensuring clean lots and pledges at least three (3) of the following activities

Reduce or eliminate fertilizer and pesticide use and application.

Conserve water and use water-saving landscape practices.

Establish and maintain healthy vegetative cover on the grounds of their property.

Keep their site clean by regularly sweeping up trash and debris.

Responsibly manage common chemicals used and stored on their property, and to properly dispose of hazardous products or materials.






Step 1: Download application form from DER website

<u>Step 2</u>: Fill out form, selecting one or more compliance options (options may be combined to get up to 100% reduction in impervious area fee)

<u>Step 3</u>: Submit completed application through CountyClick 311 website (attach to service request)









Step 4

DoE review and processing of applications may take up to 60 days

DoE and Applicant agree on the Level of Compliance to be provided

DoE Credits and adjusts the Clean Water Act Fees

DoE completes the project in the agreed upon established time frame. Not implementing the projects will result in the re-instatement of the fees

Implementation of practices are subject to DoE inspections to ensure they are built to standards

Application deadline is March 31 to be eligible for fee reduction for the coming taxable year (July – June)
