

Legal, but limited



Limitation #1: Tax Law

- "No substantial part,"
 OR
- 501(h) election
- Based on annual expenditures
- Most organizations can lobby up to 20% of their budget
- Lobbying cap limited: can only use up to 1/4 for grassroots lobbying

ANNUAL EXPENDITURES	OVERALL LOBBYING LIMIT
\$500,000 or less	20%
\$500,000 to \$1 million	\$100,000 + 15% of excess over \$500,000
\$1 million to \$1.5 million	\$175,000 + 10% of excess over \$1 million
\$1.5 million to \$17 million	\$225,000 + 5% of excess over \$1.5 million
Over \$17 million	\$1,000,000



Lobbying cap for 501(h) electing charities


Example: A 501(c)(3) with annual exempt purpose expenditures of \$500,000

Overall Lobbying Limit = 20%

\$100,000

Grassroots Lobbying Limit = 1/4 of total cap

\$25,000





Limitation #2: You promise not to

- Grants are contracts
- Some funders ask you not to use their grants for lobbying activity
- You can still lobby, but must use other funds
- You can use the grant funds for nonlobbying advocacy
- Knowing what lobbying is helps you to keep this promise





An Act


To combat trafficking in persons, especially into the sex trade, slavery, and involuntary servitude, to reauthorize certain Federal programs to prevent violence against

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Victims of Trafficking and Violence Protection Act of 2000".








Specific policy proposal


- Something counts as specific legislation if it is a "specific policy proposal"
- Not well defined, but essentially identifying a problem and a solution that can only be accomplished with new legislation
- May not be introduced, written or even fully fleshed out!





When does the clock start ticking

- Once you make the call internally all prep work and meetings count
- If you're still mulling whether to support or oppose legislation, it's probably safe to not count that "windup"
- Be consistent, act in good faith, "don't be cute"





Mixed Purpose

- What if you're doing some lobbying, some not lobbying?
- More than half of the meeting/activity is lobbying? Count it all.
- Less than half? You can track and report proportionately





Is this lobbying?

- What if you had a meeting with a member of California Assembly where you spent 40% of the time talking about a bill on disability rights and the other 60% on the Warriors win the other night?
- Communication



6 Bay Area counties order nearly 7 million people to shelter in place

Six Bay Area counties announced "shelter in place" orders for all residents on Monday — the strictest measure of its kind yet in the continental United States — directing esercyone to stay inside their homes and away from others much as possible for the next three weeks in a desperate move to curb the rapid spread of coronavirus across the region.

The directive was set to be at 12:00 a.m. Tuesday and inolives San Francisco, SantaClara, San Mateo, Marin, Contra Costa and Alamedia cointies—a combined population of more than 6.7 million. It is stay in place until at least Apr
7. The three other Bay Area counties—Sonoma, Solano and Napa—did not issue sim lar mandates.

Just outside the Bay Area, Santa Cruz County late Monday also announced a "shelter in place" under facility.







Lobbying exceptions

- Nonpartisan analysis, study, or research
- Request for technical assistance
- Self-defense
- Examinations and discussions of broad social, economic, and similar problems





Nonpartisan analysis, study, or research

RESEARCH

- Full and fair discussion
- Broadly disseminated
- May express a view
- May contain an indirect call to action
