## How you can care for sacred waters:

**USE A SHOPPING BAG** - About 2 million plastic bags are used every minute around the world. Plastic bags clog streams, rivers and the harbor. They break down into tiny pieces of plastic that are difficult to remove from God's precious water.

**PLANT A TREE** - Native trees are God's "cure all" for cleaning the water and restoring the environment to health. They purify the water, prevent soil erosion, reduce climate change and provide shade!
