**Los Angeles County Assessor Jeff Prang Endorses
Jan Perry for Los Angeles County Supervisor**

Los Angeles, Calif. (May 7, 2019) – Los Angeles County Assessor Jeff Prang today endorsed former Los Angeles City Councilwoman Jan Perry’s bid to become the 2nd District’s next Supervisor. Mr. Prang has a long history of public service that includes 18 years as a Councilmember and four terms as Mayor for the City of West Hollywood. Under his watch, the Office of the Assessor has become more modern, transparent and responsive to constituent’s needs.

“As a resident of Baldwin Hills, I can think of no better person to represent our community on the LA County Board of Supervisors than Jan Perry,” said County Assessor Prang. “Jan knows how to implement policy that is informed by the needs of everyday working families; she is committed to transparent government, excellent service to residents and most importantly, she has a record of delivering for her constituents.”

Perry and Prang have been colleagues for more than 20 years. They both served as City Council staff and elected officials, and have common interests in local environmental issues, economic development, and clean government.

“I am proud to have the endorsement of a true public servant like Jeff Prang,” said Jan Perry. “He was elected at a time when the Assessor’s office was plagued with scandal, and he has led the department with intelligence and integrity, and it would be an honor to serve Los Angeles County with him.”

Jan Perry served 12 years on the Los Angeles City Council as the representative of the 9th District which encompasses Downtown and South LA. She is considered one of the architects of the Downtown renaissance and was responsible for catalytic projects such as LA Live. During

her tenure she was responsible for the creation of \$15 billion in investment, \$52 million in net new tax revenue for the City of Los Angeles, and 90,000 full-time jobs.

From July 2013 to December 2018 Perry served as the general manager of the City of Los Angeles Economic Workforce Development Department (EWDD) where she oversaw a broad range of programs offering assistance to business, job seekers and disconnected youth. During her tenure, the department enrolled 91,000 people in its training and placement programs. Currently, she serves as the executive director of the Infrastructure Funding Alliance, a national initiative to meet future infrastructure, economic development, and environmental challenges. She lives in Ladera Heights with her daughter and her rescue dog Frank.
