National Women's Political Caucus Los Angeles County Endorses Jan Perry

Los Angeles, Calif. (September 27, 2019) – The National Women's Political Caucus (NWPC) Los Angeles County Coordinating Council has endorsed Jan Perry's campaign to become the next Supervisor for Los Angeles County's 2nd District. NWPC has a broad grassroots footprint and provides financial and technical support to women who are seeking elected and appointed office at all levels of government.

NWPC endorses candidates who are steadfast advocates for issues critical to women such as access to affordable abortion and reproductive health services, equal rights, equal pay for women, and increased availability of quality childcare. "Jan Perry is a proven champion for NWPC's bottom line issues, she's worked to provide access to reproductive health services, ensured women have access to training to secure good paying jobs, and created permanent supportive housing for women who find themselves without a home," said Dr. Carmen Estrada Schaye, NWPC National Vice President of Diversity. She continued, "We are proud to support Councilwoman Perry and look forward to working with her to create policy that ensures a bright future for the women of LA County."

As an LA City Councilmember, Perry worked with Planned Parenthood to open two clinics, one of which is in the South Park area and serves as the local organization's headquarters. "NWPC is an important organization that is focused on women's empowerment through political change," said Perry. The Councilwoman is widely known for her work to build supportive housing for women including grandparents raising grandchildren and emancipated young women and is pleased to work with NWPC to implement their policy goals. "I'm excited to have this endorsement, because when you advocate for women you change the world and I am proud to be with NWPC on this journey."

For 12 years, Jan Perry served as the Councilwoman for the City of Los Angeles' 9th District. Upon leaving office, Perry served as the general manager of the City of Los Angeles Economic and Workforce Development Department (EWDD) from July 2013 to December 2018, where she oversaw a broad range of programs offering assistance to business, job seekers and disconnected youth. During her tenure, the department enrolled approximately 91,000 people in its training and placement programs.

Currently, Perry serves as the executive director of the Infrastructure Funding Alliance, a national initiative to meet future infrastructure, economic development, and environmental challenges. She lives in Ladera Heights with her daughter and her rescue dog Frank.
