

WILLIAMSON COUNTY

★ Williamson County voters will have the opportunity to vote on two propositions regarding issuing road bonds and park bonds. Bond elections allow voters to decide whether or not to use long-term financing through the sale of bonds for major capital improvement projects such as new construction and expansion of roads, parks and trails. The Road and Bridge tax rate only covers maintenance and operation for existing roadways.

Proposition A: Vote YES

Why: This item authorizes the county to issue and sell bonds not to exceed \$412 million for road construction and safety improvements. The bond package includes improvements in District 6 at the intersection of Parmer and SH45 and drainage improvements in the Forest North neighborhood.



Proposition B: Vote YES

Why: This item authorizes the county to issue and sell bonds not to exceed \$35 million for parks, trails and recreation. The bond package includes improvements in the area bordering District 6, Cedar Park, and Brushy Creek.

★ Two more petition-led ordinances are up for a vote this November. The signature threshold is just 2% of voters leading to a cottage industry of paid-for petition gatherers funded by special interest money that misrepresent the actual impact of the vote. The main backers of these petitions remain the same list of power brokers that thrived under the old system that favored Central Austin over areas like District 6.



Proposition A: Vote NO

Why: This item sets up new barriers to future youth, recreation, or sports facilities built on public land. It would also disrupt our ongoing efforts to build a new YMCA and related sports fields in District 6. It was originally targeting the soccer stadium but even the opponents of soccer no longer support this proposition.

** Voters in the ETJ surrounding Austin are able to vote on this item but would not be able to vote in the elections this item would require! This includes Rattan Creek, Forest North, and apartments along Parmer Ln.*



Proposition B: Vote NO

Why: This item would eliminate newly expanded funding for music, culture, and historic preservation, as well as new funding for homelessness solutions paid for through the hotel tax and convention center expansion. Under state law, hotel taxes cannot be spent in the ways this ballot item requires and only convention center expansion creates this new available funding.
