### About Lalor

Named after Peter Lalor, leader of the Eureka Stockade rebellion in 1854, the electorate of Lalor is a growing and changing region.

As the home of the Woiwuring and Wathaurung people, it is a place that encompasses both old and new.

Little River and Werribee were established by early settlers as stop over points, while newer areas of Point Cook, Truganina and Tarneit are rapidly expanding.

Industry in Lalor is a mix of manufacturing and production, market gardening and farming, as well as tourism and services.

The main suburbs include Altona Meadows (part), Hoppers Crossing, Laverton, Laverton North, Little River, Point Cook, Seabrook, Tarneit, Truganina (part), Werribee, Werribee South, Williams Landing and Wyndham Vale. Rural areas of Cocoroc, Eynesbury (part), Mambourin, Mount Cottrell (part) and Quandong are also included.

## The Electorate

**Demographic rating:** outer metropolitan.

**Area and location:** The Division of Lalor is located to the south-west of Melbourne. It covers an area of approximately 546 sq km. Lalor is a rapidly expanding area extending from Port Phillip Bay inland.

**Electors enrolled:** 121 504 (at 31.3.16).

**Industries:** Some heavy industries and manufacturing, market gardening, wineries, Melbourne's water treatment plant, Werribee Racecourse and Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre, Werribee Mercy Hospital, University of Melbourne Veterinary School, Agriculture and Food Technology Precinct, tertiary education facilities, Werribee Open Range Zoo, tourism precincts including beaches, retail precincts and shopping centres.

**State electorates:** Lalor includes the Victorian Legislative Assembly electorate Werribee, Tarneit, and parts of Altona and Lara.
