Labor's commitment to sport and recreation

Labor provided significant funding to build and upgrade local sport and recreation facilities across our region, such as:

- \$9 million for the Western Indoors Sports Hub
- \$71,000 for the expansion of the Skate Park in McCormack Park, Laverton
- \$398,000 the upgrade of the Werribee Outdoor Olympic Pool
- \$380,000 for the installation of synthetic grass on the Grange soccer pitch
- \$180,000 for new terracing spectator mounds at Chirnside Park
- \$180,000 to install the cricket wicket, training lights and oval upgrades at Featherbrook Oval, Point Cook
- \$681,000 for construction of Arndell Park Community Centre and Sports Pavillion at Truganina
