Train Station upgrades: delayed

Secret documents reveal that the Baird-Berejiklian Government has delayed critically urgent upgrades at Lewisham, Petersham and Dulwich Hill stations.


Lewisham Station regularly floods and none of these stations allows for access by elderly passengers. commuters with disability or parents with prams.

Hundreds of residents signed my petition calling for an upgrade, only to be ignored.

Meanwhile, the station flooded again during recent storms, suspending train services along the T2 Inner West Line.

Our stations must be upgraded now to ensure our public transport is safe, dependable and accessible to all.

Meanwhile, the Government has introduced brand new tolls onto the M4. Residents are dealing with traffic congestion, road closures, round-the-clock construction, dust, vibrations and noise.

I have invited the new Minister for WestConnex to visit Haberfield and Ashfield and meet with residents. Residents deserve to be heard.


Improving public schools should be priority number one for the new Education Minister. Seven schools in the Summer Hill electorate have maintenance backlogs of more than \$500,000. Too many of our schools are bursting at the seams and can't fix even basic repairs.

We need now:

- A full audit of all government land to see what space is available for new schools;
- A proper investment in education to make sure our teachers have all the resources they need;
- A genuine conversation with the community about the feasibility of multi-level schools.

HOUSING AFFORDABILITY

We have a housing affordability crisis in NSW and we need to act now if we want to ensure access to stable, safe and affordable housing for everyone.

While the Berejiklian Government reaps the rewards of record stamp duty revenue, they're selling off the Land and Property Information office, which experts say will drive up housing costs. They're selling off public housing

and they're doing little to address the financial pressure on renters. Shamefully, there isn't enough support for those in boarding houses or sleeping rough.

We can't just increase supply. We need to address the inequity of negative gearing now and introduce innovative policies like inclusionary zoning (quotas for affordable housing) to deliver housing for those who can least afford it.
