- Demonstrate expertise in the subject they will teach as evidenced by personal skills and knowledge, an undergraduate major or minor or graduate degree in the subject they will teach, or direct subject-area teaching experience.
- Demonstrated ability to work well with team members.
- Demonstrated communication skills.
- Demonstrated ability to evaluate tests and measurements of achievement.
- Understanding and commitment to the Hawaiian language immersion philosophy

- Able to speak Hawaiian fluently
- Experience working in charter school environment.
- Ability to communicate effectively with parents, students, and staff verbally and in writing

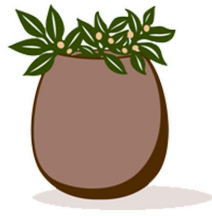
