

VISITATION BILL TIMELINE

- July 6, 2011: Troy Martin drafts the first proposal for the Visitation Bill after his involvement in The Conservatorship of Peter Falk. The proposal is sent to two California state legislators, but both decline to sponsor the bill.
- October 1, 2013: After Casey Kasem's second wife Jean isolates Casey from his children, family, and friends, the Kasem children hold a peaceful protest in front of Casey's home.
- November 2013: Kerri Kasem decides to form a nonprofit organization to fight for visitation rights. Catherine Falk introduces Troy Martin to Kerri Kasem. Catherine Falk requests that Troy Martin and Catherine Falk be included in the Board of Directors for this nonprofit organization and that it use the proposed Visitation Bill drafted by Troy Martin.



- December 5, 2013: The Kasem-Falk Foundation is officially formed. Troy Martin modifies the Visitation Bill to create a procedure for obtaining visitation without filing a petition for conservatorship.



- December 15, 2013: Catherine Falk quits the organization. The nonprofit is renamed the Kasem Cares Foundation.
- December 26, 2013: Legislative Counsel provides first version of Visitation Bill based upon Troy Martin's proposed language. The first version of the Visitation Bill is numbered AB 2034.
- May 29, 2014: AB 2034 passes the Assembly unanimously and is submitted to the Senate.
- August 28, 2014: Assemblyman Mike Gatto and the Kasem Cares Foundation agree to withdraw AB 2034 and submit a new bill in the next legislative session.
- January 14, 2015: The California Senate Judiciary Committee redrafts the Visitation Bill with help of Aaron Moreno, Robert Naylor, and Troy Martin.



- February 28, 2015: The Visitation Bill is resubmitted to the California Assembly as AB 1085.
- March 2, 2015: Senator Brad Zaun of Iowa introduces SF 360, a Visitation Bill based on AB 2034. A similar bill, SF 306, which was proposed by Misty Davis and sponsored by Senator Paul Hogg then takes its place. Kerri Kasem and Iowa radio host, Simon Conway lobbied the bill and made media appearances in favor of SF 306.
- March 9, 2015: The Visitation Bill based on the language of AB 2034 is submitted to the Texas House of Representatives as HB 2665 by Representative Joe Moody.
- March 17, 2015: The Iowa Senate unanimously passes SB 306.



- April 6, 2015: Aaron Moreno, Robert Naylor, and Troy Martin meet with representatives from the California Assembly Judiciary Committee, California

Judicial Council, and California State Bar to discuss language of AB 1085.

- April 7, 2015: The Iowa House of Representatives unanimously passes SB 306.
- April 24, 2015: Iowa Governor Terry Branstad signs SF 306 into law. Kerri Kasem, Troy Martin, and the Kasem Cares Foundation are invited to the signing ceremony.
- May 6, 2015: AB 1085 passes through the California Assembly Judiciary Committee on consent.
- May 8, 2015: The Texas House of Representatives passes HB 2665 with a vote of 136-1.
- May 22, 2015: The California Assembly passes AB 1085 unanimously.
- May 25, 2015: The Texas Senate unanimously passes HB 2665.
- June 1, 2015: Texas Governor Greg Abbott signs HB 2665 into law.
- June 25, 2015: The California Senate passes AB 1085 unanimously.
- July 14, 2015: California Governor Jerry Brown signs AB 1085 into law.
