Hertfordshire County Council Election in St Nicholas, Woodfield and Martins Wood

I have been proud to represent the St Nicholas Division (St Nicholas, Martins Wood and Woodfield) on the County Council since 2013.

I have actively supported and funded the increase in facilities for young families in the area including the Hampson Park, St Nicholas Park and the play centre. We have great facilities for children and young people which are extensively used, particularly at holiday times. I have just financed a 'Sensory Garden' project for St Nicholas, and I am helping to establish a Junior Parkrun in Stevenage.

I work closely with local residents, the community centres and local businesses. I also attend the local residents committee and work with the Police to ensure any issues or concerns are investigated and resolved as soon as possible.

If re-elected on 4th May I will keep working for you and pressure the County Council to make our roads, pathways and cycleways safe and fit for use. I will challenge the Council to keep our street lights on all night, *where residents want it*, invest in our much needed bus service, and fund Social Care properly.

Working For You in St Nicholas

Residents raised their concerns about speeding in St Nicholas, so I funded Speed Indicator Signs which have helped slow traffic in the area. I organised an upgrade in pathways and ramps for buggy and wheelchair users to provide safe access to The Oval shopping area. I challenged the County Council to upgrade the lighting at The Oval, and pushed for the roadway and bus lane to be resurfaced. The fantastic mural at Sefton Road underpass was funded through my local budget.

In line with the Labour Party manifesto for the Hertfordshire County Council, I aim to work to improve local children's services. This includes ensuring that funding is provided to the Hertfordshire Home Start program, and maintain, rebuild and support our Sure Start Centres. I will also work to improve the state of local waste management, with the aim of re-opening all Household Waste Recycling sites 7 days a week.

Labour's Plan for 1,000,000 New Homes

Under the Tories, rents are soaring, home ownership is falling, and house building fell to its lowest peacetime rate since the 1920s. We're making a commitment: Labour will build over a million new homes and tackle the broken private rented sector, so our children won't grow up in damp, overcrowded and insecure housing. The Leader of the Labour Party has pledged that Labour would "effectively end homelessness in its first term in government", a commitment that would have an enormous positive impact on our

communities in Stevenage. Labour's pledge would provide thousands of new homes in Stevenage, and offer our young people the opportunity to rent or buy affordably in the local area.

More Money Secured for Stevenage


