Worthing needs a forward-looking transport plan, and that has to include ways of reducing car journeys in and around the town. We urgently need a network of well-constructed cycleways.

"The cycleway through the Goring shopping parade is an example of a poorly financed scheme. I will press for proper funding for high quality, safe cycleways across the town."

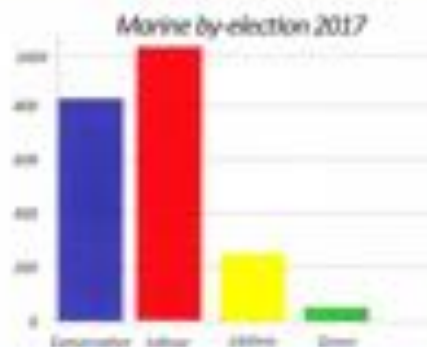


Sam's other pledges for Marine residents
