Update on Lakanal Fire

Residents have raised concerns with me about the length of time the police investigation is taking. I have a meeting next week with the chief investigating officers to discuss the timescale.

I have requested that the fire advice for Marie Curie residents be reviewed - residents are fearful because the people who died in Lakanal followed advice to stay in their homes. Yesterday I had a response from Ron Dobson (London's Chief fire officer) refusing to review the fire advice for Marie Curie. I will request a meeting with him – it is essential people feel safe in their homes.

Leigh Day & Co Solicitors, who are representing Sceaux Garden's T&RA, have written to Sir Justice Thayne Forbes and requested that the T&RA be considered "a properly interested person" at the "super inquest". I have written to support this request.

Casework

I had a particularly busy advice surgery on Tuesday this week with over 100 people seeking help – the office has called the people who were not able to wait and chose to leave their numbers – we are working hard to ensure that everyone has a response within 10 working days.



Dear Friend.

As you know the race is on for the next Leader of our Party. This is going to be an important election for Labour as we are choosing someone to lead us in opposition and to be the next Prime Minister. We have to be determined not just to get back into government but to make sure that we protect people from what might be the worst excesses of the Tory/ Lib Dem coalition government. The new leader of the Labour Party will be announced on September 25th.

I am making sure that the leadership election runs smoothly and when the new leader is elected I will be their deputy. So I am not casting a vote and will remain neutral. This election marks a milestone for this country as it is the first time in any political party that the leadership contenders include a black candidate. Diane Abbot was nominated to be one of the candidates for Labour's leader and that was a proud day for women, a proud day for black people and a proud day for the Labour Party. Four million people will vote in the leadership election luding party members and members of the affiliated Trades Unions and socialist societies. New members who join before 8th September can also vote, so please encourage friends and families to join.

As many of you know this month saw the brutal murder of a 17 year Samuel Ogunro whose body was found in Jowett St. On Saturday 5th June I joined the Police at the scene to call for people with any information to come forward. No-one should have to endure the loss of their beloved son in such terrible circumstances. We need to catch the culprits for the sake of Samuel, for his bereaved mother and father and for the sake of the decent hardworking community of Peckham who deserve to know that those who stoop to brutal murder will not get away with it; they will be caught and sent to prison.

In my current position as Acting Leader I'm pleased to be able to raise constituents' concerns at Prime Minister's Questions. On Friday 4th June I joined local residents and Cllrs on the Poets Corner Estate in Peckham, they informed me of repeated anti-social behaviour and drug dealing on the estate. They are asking for CCTV cameras to be installed to help provide evidence and convict those responsible. I have challenged the Prime Minister over the Coalition Government's plans to make it harder for local authorities to install CCTV cameras.

This will ensure that they have legal representation and advice during the Lakanal Fire inquest.

Four local schools are due to be re-built as part of Labour's Building Schools for the Future programme. These are Highshore School, St Michaels & All Angels, Sacred Heart and St Thomas the Apostle. The funding for this is now under threat from the Coalition Government. I have met the head teachers of St Thomas the Apostle and Highshore. I have made representations to the Education Secretary Michael Gove MP and have challenged the Prime Minister on this important issue at PMQs. These crucial works must go ahead so that our children have the buildings and facilities to learn in that they deserve.

Report to GC, Thursday 16th September 2010, St Giles Centre

Dear Friend,

In the Emergency Budget earlier this year the Chancellor, George Osborne, said that his Budget would be a fair Budget. He promised that it would "protect the most vulnerable in our society". I feared that this would not be the case and that it would hit those who could least afford it the hardest. A recent report by the Institute for Fiscal Studies has shown that sadly, I was right. This Budget will hit the poorest hardest.

I will be working with Southwark Council to protect the most vulnerable – especially disabled people, the elderly and children in care. And even though the Government have abandoned it we will keep a very clear eye on the issue of equality.

The Tory and Lib-Dem Government is cutting vital police funding which has already led to fewer police officers on our streets – we must ensure that this doesn't happen in Southwark.

I am campaigning with Tessa Jowell MP, Val Shawcross our Labour London Assembly Member and local organisations to ensure that police numbers in Southwark are not cut. Local residents value the Safer Neighbourhood Teams and the close connection beat police officers develop with an area. If numbers are cut and Safer Neighbourhood Teams are scaled back then the impact on local people will be significant. Cutting back police and Community Support Officers will lead to an increase in crime which no-one wants to see and which will cost society and the economy more over time.

In 12 days time I will be handing over to our new Leader. My task over the month I have been acting leader has been to ensure that after our General Election defeat we picked ourselves up and fought back. And that is exactly what the party has done.

Since may 6th 32,411 new members have joined the party – the fastest increase in our membership ever recorded. The party finances are on a sound footing. Our Labour MPs and shadow cabinet are united as an effective and energetic opposition. Nationally in council by-elections we are winning more votes that the Tories – reversing the gap at the General Election. Votes cast in council by-elections show labour 34% tories 28% lib/Dems 20%

So I look forward to handing over to our new leader and carrying on with my work as Deputy Leader.

The Comprehensive spending review – 20th October 2010

With the Tories - backed by the Lib/Dems - planning to cut benefits as well as police and schools - it is more important than ever that the Labour Party is out on the doorstep listening to local people's concerns and showing people we are on their side.

I have written a letter to the Home Secretary and Mayor of London signed by all Southwark MPs, Val Shawcross AM and all Labour and Lib Dem Southwark Councillors urging them to protect police numbers in Southwark. I have received an encouraging response from the Mayor of London and am awaiting a response from the Home Secretary.

On 26th October 2010 I met with Cllr Ian Wingfield and Cllr Fiona Colley to see how we can work together to protect constituents from changes to Housing Benefits and protect the tenancy rights of residents of the Aylesbury. I have written to Grant Shapps MP and am awaiting a response.

Camberwell and Peckham International Advisory Panel

I am honoured and privileged to have been appointed Shadow Secretary of State for International Development. Setting up the Department for International Development (DFID) and trebling our international aid are among the most important achievements of the previous Labour Government. Making sure this Government maintains our leadership on international development will be my main objective.

I know that many people in Camberwell and Peckham is concerned about tackling global poverty. I have set up the Camberwell and Peckham International Advisory Panel which will meet for the first time on 3rd December 2010. Please let me know if you would like to join the panel.
