Didactic Training

DIVERSITY & INCLUSION

Training focus: cultural humility/personal reflections, a multicultural lens, understanding history, systemic issues, diversity, inclusion, reparations and becoming an effective change agent.

First Semester Focus: Psychodynamic and Attachment based approaches to the therapeutic work.

Second Semester Focus: Trauma Informed Lens.

Second Semester Focus: Trauma Focused CBT

Case Consultation

FORMAL PRESENTATION

Interns will provide formal case presentations 2 or 3 times per year.

CONCEPTUALIZATION

Interns will be assigned to provide conceptualizations based on the formal presentation on various topics.

Focus: Referrals, Professionalism and Documentation

Collaborative consultation for professional and clinical matters.

SPANISH LANGUAGE

Group Supervision to ensure effective communication and therapeutic interventions with Spanish Language therapy.

CHILD & FAMILY CLINIC

Child and Family Clinic offers ongoing individual and family psychotherapy services to children and youth (ages 0-21) with full-scope Medi-Cal; however, we have some capacity to serve uninsured children and youth. Services are provided at agency offices, home settings, school-settings, and/or other field locations in order to ensure the most effective interventions. Bilingual (Spanish/English) services available. **Spanish Fluency Required**

YOUTH FOR CHANGE

Youth for Change is an outpatient adolescent substance use treatment program for youth between the ages of 12 and 21 years old. Youth for Change provides multi-cultural, compassionate SUD services to meet youth where they are at! Our Counselors are trained to outreach, assess and engage youth in treatment services such as individual, group, and collateral. While working with youth, counselors support clients in identifying their personal goals around their substance use, work with their families to strengthen their relationship and community involvement.
