SUMMARY OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF PRECINCT COMMITTEEMAN/COMMITTEEWOMAN

MANDATORY PRIOR TO MEMBERSHIP APPROVAL

Upon completion of the Application for Membership and the Loyalty Oaths, it is mandatory that you attend an Orientation Session prior to your application being processed for membership.

MANDATORY SUBSEQUENT TO MEMBERSHIP APPROVAL

- 1. Abide by the loyalty oath executed pursuant to Republican Party of Florida, Rule 9, which states the REC members "will not actively, publicly, or financially support the election of any candidate other than the Republican candidate in a partisan unitary, general or special election, or a registered Republican in non-partisan elections... [other than judicial races governed by Chapter 105, Florida Statutes], if there is a registered Republican running for the same office.
- 2. Abide by the governing documents for REC members, copies of which will be provided to all members. These include the applicable Florida Statutes, and state and county party constitutions, rules and bylaws.
- 3. Attend all regular meetings of the REC unless appropriate excuses are provided.

 A County Executive Committee member who is absent for three (3) consecutive meetings without a valid excused absence shall be removed from the County Executive Committee as of the date of the third consecutive missed meeting.
- 4. Actively campaign for the party's candidates in the member's precinct in each election cycle through voter contact via door-to-door campaigning, direct mail or telephone calls. (REC members must work their precincts at election time but have flexibility to determine the methods by which this vital role is accomplished, including the recruitment of volunteers and others to assist.)

OPTIONAL BUT STRONGLY ENCOURAGED

- 1. Volunteer to serve on one or more of the Republican Executive Committee's standing, issue, campaign, or event (e.g., Lincoln Day Dinner) committees, and/or assist as a volunteer at party headquarters and special events.
- 2. Attend the Lincoln Day Dinner as a paid guest, and get others to do the same, and otherwise assist the party's fund raising efforts.
- 3. Join a Republican club and participate in that club's activities (or consider organizing one if none exists in your area).
- 4. If appropriately interested, dedicated and qualified, consider getting involved in a party leadership role, as a committee chair or party officer, or as a candidate for public office.
