For example we have highlighted the appalling Ofsted report into Children's services in Bromley - found to be inadequate on all aspects - where vulnerable children were put at risk by the council's obsession with cutting costs. We asked question after question, made phone call after phone call, trying to find out why a private road had been resurfaced by the Council - only to be told it was a "mistake". We highlighted the shortfall in school places more than two years ago - we've joined with residents' groups and parents' groups to help bring pressure to bear on the council to be proactive about building new schools - the right schools in the right places, which means we supported the Bullers Wood School for Boys and opposed the SHaW Academy on Westmoreland Road (right school, wrong location). We're campaigning hard against the merger of Bromley's police force with Croydon and Sutton and we're working hard for residents against over development in Bromley Town.

School Places for All Our Children

We have a predicted shortage of secondary school places in Bromley necessitating at least 3 new schools in the Borough by 2022. Despite this we have seen 1000s of people take to the streets in support of the parents of the 11-year-old boys hoping for a place at a new Bullers Wood for Boys secondary school after it had its planning permission revoked just a few weeks before national offer day for school places.

The shortage of secondary school places has been known for 10 years - but this does not mean we will support any school anywhere, we need the right schools in the right location and we need the plans for these put in place before the last minute. This is why we campaigned against the application for a 10 storey secondary school for 1200 pupils with no playing fields on one of the Borough's busiest and most polluted junctions at Bromley South. A school at this unsuitable site lets our children down rather than insisting a more suitable site is found such as the Civic Centre.

A more holistic approach to planning for schools is needed and those plans should include road safety improvements to facilitate walking and cycling to school to ease congestion; rather than allow congestion and road safety concerns to be used as a reason to refuse any new school.

We need a Council with more vision and coordinated planning to ensure this happens - the Lib Dems have that vision.
