# Devolution – Rod Cantrill is standing as our Lib Dem Mayoral candidate

## **Budgets – County Council and District Council**

You will have heard that the County Council has now set its budget. The Lib Dem group argued that, in difficult times for local government caused by increased demands on services and reducing support from central government, it would be better prioritise services for the most vulnerable rather than keep council taxes as

low as possible. We argued the case for a 4% increase (2% for Adult Social Care and 2% for other services). but we were unable to convince others. We will have a 2% increase for 2017-18. Huntingdonshire District Council must now set its budget and is proposing a 2% increase now the Conservative led Council has finally conceded that its financial strategy isn't working. Last year your councillors made that point and were told our assessment was "misguided" and that the strategy of no increase year on year until 2020 was sound....what a difference a year makes!
