Dear Grafham residents,

It has been a privilege to be your County Councillor for last 12 years. I have learnt a great deal by meeting so many people from different walks of life.

Working with various District Councillor colleagues, currently Patricia Jordan and John Morris, I have been able to support you in giving advice and sometimes solving problems, alas not always.

An important part of my activity over many years has been to keep you fully informed on council matters. I have done this, year in and year out, through FOCUS and I am very grateful for the help received from a loyal team of leaflet deliverers.

The County Council electoral division comprises more villages than just Brampton and Grafham and over the years I have had the chance to see at first hand how things work in 14 other villages in the local area. I have come to realise just how important parish councils can be in shaping local life and this is why I always keep in close touch with them all. I have attended over 700 parish council meetings in my total of 16 years as a County Councillor.

You will know from reading our regular FOCUS leaflets that the County Council is going through an increasingly difficult time as funding is cut for local services at the same time as demand is growing. My personal approach is to work as collaboratively as possible with councillors from different political groups to find the best outcome in challenging circumstances.

The Liberal Democrat group on the County Council is a very able and experienced team of people from a range of backgrounds. My specialist contribution is, not surprisingly, related to education and young people. I hope that my experience and knowledge can be of help in a rapidly-changing world.

There can be no disguising the fact that, in the social and political life of this country, we are going through a very unsettled period which many of us find distressing. It would be tempting to give up but I have offered to stand again for election because I believe that, locally and nationally, the country needs the Liberal Democrats to speak up for policies which reject the extreme views expressed by some other parties, seeking to bring people together rather than divide them, aiming to make society fairer while recognising that we need to build a strong economy.

I hope you will re-elect me to allow me to continue with this challenging task.

The Liberal Democrat priorities in difficult times

Cambridgeshire County Council is facing serious financial challenges. Central government has been cutting financial support and capping council tax increases.

At the same time we have a fast-growing population, more people living longer and needing more care, more children needing school places. We do not intend to make glib promises but these are our main priorities:

Helping children from deprived backgrounds to get a good start in life and supporting their families

Supporting the elderly to live safely and happily in their own homes for as long as possible

Investing in public transport to reduce isolation in rural areas

Making local government more cost-effective by reducing the number of councils

Keeping our roads and pavements safe - well maintained, properly lit and gritted

The Cambridgeshire Conservatives have irresponsibly failed to take up the option (permitted by government) to raise council tax by 2% for general services. Our feedback suggests that people are prepared to pay slightly more to protect the essential services we all need and will need even more in future.

Peter Downes was Head of Hinchingsbrooke School. In 'retirement' he has been active in the local community as a District Councillor (1997-2013) and as County Councillor since 2001. He has been Councillor for Grafham since 2005. He is a Governor at the Brampton Village Primary School.
