Update on County Council Conservatives continue to slash services – and it will hit children's services and the vulnerable the most

Budget News

Cambridgeshire County Council needs to make at least £30m of savings next year because of Tory government policies for local government including cutting its grants. Demand for services is growing here as the population rises and people are living longer, often with more acute care needs. Now there is a Tory majority on the County Council, we are seeing a more strident approach to making cuts – previously as the County was more politically balanced we had been able to reign in some of the more extreme ideas.

The Conservatives are also looking at ways to increase contributions from people receiving disability benefits. The Lib Dems are concerned about this as it would be taking money away from some of the poorest and most vulnerable people in society.

As Lib Dems, we believe that we should be doing more to join up services with the health service and look seriously at merging county and district council services. Independent surveys also show most people would be prepared to pay slightly more for their council services if they knew the money would go to help the most vulnerable in society and maintain essential infrastructure.

Funding to support the young cut by 19%

The Conservative led County Council have cut £0.9m out of the current budget of £5m for the Children's Centres across the county. They justified this proposal by saying that they can use fewer buildings and cut over £700k on 'management and business support' whilst providing a small increase in 'front-line services'.

This sounds great, but we are worried that in reality it will mean less services are available. Godmanchester's Children's Centre is going to be shut, and services will 'pop up' here and in Huntingdon.

We sincerely hope that doesn't mean less is offered but it will mean there is no longer a focused location in Godmanchester for help, support and to access services.

County Councillor Graham Wilson is concerned that, if we fail to provide the support that some young children and their families need while the children are still young, life will be much more difficult later on for them and the costs to taxpayers will be much greater.

News from Huntingdonshire District Council

Parking enforcement

Parking, or rather poor and dangerous parking, is an ongoing problem. The District Council are developing a Parking Strategy, but we worry that unless it deals with parking enforcement we won't see any real difference. The only bodies that have the legal powers to issue tickets are the Police and the District Council. The Police don't have the time to deal with nuisance parking but will enforce dangerous parking. The District Council have so far chosen only to enforce its own car parks. We continue to lobby for the powers to be enforced by the District Council or to be given to the Town Council.

We are pleased to see shoppers flocking to Huntingdon, drawn in by the new shops, but like you have been fed up by the new queues to get in to and out of the "Sainsbury's" car park. HDC assure us they are working to improve the traffic flows and signage. And remember there is a lot of spare capacity in the multi-storey car park.

Case work updates Some good news!

You will have noticed that there has been some patching of the worst pot-holes in the town. Now we are trying to get the lines replaced. If you notice potholes that need repairing or lines that need painting please report them on the Cambridgeshire County Council web site. We are also working with County Highways to see what might be done to address the worst pavement surfaces: again, please report these online too.

We started working on this three years ago! In the last Focus we told you that work was agreed, and we had been told it would be done before Christmas. A change in personnel at Highways England has put us back, with a new officer starting the process from scratch. We are deeply frustrated by this but are working hard to do all we can to get the project back on track. In the meantime, HDC's street cleaning team are now cleaning every three weeks- but the sheer number of birds means it's not making much of a difference. We haven't given up and hope this work will be done very soon.
