There have been very preliminary discussions with Hammersmith and Fulham, Capco and GLA with a formal set of plans. Should a new master plan be put forward, the GLA, local boroughs and the applicant will engage in a pre-application process, which will include public consultation. I have been clear that should an application be submitted, I will review this against the policies set out in the London Plan, including density and scale
