DO NOT WALK ON THE NEWLY LAID, HOT SURFACE

Please take care when walking on the surface as it may take time to fully cool.

If you walk or cycle on the road and you get bitumen on your clothes or shoes, it can be removed with a proprietary cleaner.

Look out for your pets walking on the new surface especially when walking your dog, or if your cat is roaming around.

We are writing to you to let you know that resurfacing works will be taking place in Talbot Road.

When are the works taking place?


The preparatory works will start on Friday 5 March and we will return to carry out resurfacing works on the 16 March. The works will take up to 8 working days to complete, weather permitting. Our working hours will be 7:30am—5:00pm. There will be no weekend working. The road will be closed to traffic between Tuesday 16 March and Wednesday 24 March in three sections. Diversions will be in place and there will be no on-street parking in the section we are working whilst the road is closed.

Q. Why are you doing this?

A. We are contracted to maintain the roads and pavements in the city. Talbot Road has been highlighted as requiring resurfacing works to increase the longevity of the road.



What precautions should I take during the road works?

Do not walk or cycle on the newly laid, hot surface. If you walk or cycle on the road by mistake, please check that you don't have bitumen on your shoes or bike. In the event that you do get bitumen on your clothes or shoes, it can be removed with a proprietary cleaner. Please also look out for your pets walking on the new surface especially cats who may be out roaming around.

Q. What impact could the roadworks have on me?

A. There will be no on-street parking in the sections of which we are working in Talbot Road during excavation, surfacing and road markings. Please be advised that any vehicle hindering or obstructing our operations will need to be moved under The Portsmouth City Council (Highway Maintenance and Public cleansing No.54 Temporary Prohibition of driving Loading and Waiting order) 2020. Please park your vehicle in an alternative location such as on neighbouring streets to help us complete the work quickly.

Road users are advised to expect some delays and use alternative routes where possible. Please also allow extra time for journeys. We will endeavour to maintain vehicular access for residents and businesses, however, this will be restricted at times. Footways will be open for pedestrians.

Q. Will the work be noisy?

A. Some aspects of this work will be noisy, mostly the excavation of the road surface which starts on Tuesday 16 March. There will also be bleepers from our vehicles when reversing, these are mandatory for health and safety reasons. We will endeavour to keep all noise to a minimum and your patience on this matter is appreciated.
