Over 1500 new houses in Faversham have been approved by Swale Council. The pressure from central government is for yet more on top of that. Conservative controlled Swale Borough Council is simply accepting that Swale as a whole must build 1050 new houses each year. Local Lib Dem Councillor

Ben A Martin says "we must be practical, Faversham cannot legally reject what has already been approved. But we can push hard for good design and high quality. There has to be excellent landscaping to improve the environment, and for each development to provide the type of housing that Faversham needs. Lib Dems led by Mike Henderson at Swale Borough Council are doing just that with some success. Just as important however is to make the biggest proportion possible affordable for local people, to buy, to rent, or via equity share. Infrastructure and services to provide for the new housing must arrive with the housing growth, not 10 years later." Ben concludes "I am fighting for Faversham to have a reduction in its proportion of planned future numbers compared with other parts of Swale. Badly planned expansion will damage our town and the surrounding countryside which is almost all either grade 1 farmland, Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty or nationally and internationally protected nature reserve."

News in Brief

Where is our Creek Bridge? – Will it be this year? We certainly hope so. Lib Dem County Councillor Antony Hook is pressing KCC hard to get on with it. Conservative leader Paul Carter recently came to Faversham, but seemed to have little to say other than to outrageously suggest that Faversham Town Council tax payers should stump up some more money. Antony Hook and the local team are working closely with the Faversham Creek Trust, the Where's our Bridge Campaign and many others locally to ensure that 2019 is the year.

Anderson's Ham Road Development – Plans for the first 117 houses out of a total of 330 are in at Swale Council. Local Lib Dem Councillor Ben A Martin is preparing a detailed submission to Anderson, the developer, calling for improvements to the layout of houses, the design and quality of build, the landscaping and environment improvements and the treatment around the edge of the lake. A meeting with the developers is expected within a few weeks.

Swale Council Budget – the usual stingy Conservative budget which does little to look after the most disadvantaged people locally has been published. Again it leaves some £15 million of reserves unused and yet again we see Sittingbourne and Sheppey get most of the investment – for example £2 million for Sittingbourne and Sheppey leisure centres and zero for Faversham Swimming Pools. Lib Dems will be proposing improvements to this budget. What do you think? Any ideas to **Mike**


