Here are some of the things we've already delivered with the support of our full-time officers and hundreds of residents:

#### Addressing the climate emergency

• We declared a climate emergency and committed that the council will be carbon neutral by 2030.

• Plans for the new café in Victoria Park have been redesigned, to make it sustainable and carbon neutral.

• We set up a cross-party Climate Working Emergency Group, independently measured our carbon footprint and set an annual target to reduce it; we are investing in modern technology for the Town Hall to reduce our CO2 and save money.

We held our first Community Climate Change Workshop in September to share our plans and invite input. We'll hold two workshops a year going forward.

• Victoria Park was recognised as being an outstanding facility for our community and awarded the prestigious Green Flag

• We have put funds in place to replace the play equipment in Skyllings. The original equipment will be given a new lease of life in City Recreation Ground.

Fostering a sense of community • Led by the Council, the horticultural community of Newbury won the Britain in Bloom Silver Gilt Award, and the Inspiring Everyone to Grow Award.

We organised the Family Fun Day in Victoria Park, Newbury in Bloom, the Remembrance Sunday Parade, and contributed to the Christmas lights.

Providing focused support for young people, the elderly and vulnerable

The Council has committed to increasing the level of youth support in Newbury, and to backing West Berkshire Citizens Advice, for the next four years.

The last few months have been busy for Liberal Democrat-led Thatcham Town Council. Thatcham Festival in October was our most successful ever with most events fully booked. We are going to refurbish the toilets in the Broadway, resurface the play parks, addressing a legacy of under investment in maintenance of Town Council properties, provide financial support to our local Library, and distribute funds to several local good causes, all with the Community and value for money at the heart of our decision making.
