# Labor Environment Action Network (NSW Branch) Rules

## A. Organisation

- A.1 The name of the organisation is 'Labor Environment Action Network (NSW Branch)' hereafter known as 'LEAN'
- A.2 LEAN is a voluntary non-for-profit unincorporated association

# B. Objectives

- B.1 LEAN's Objectives are:
  - 1. To drive environmental protection and sustainability
  - 2. To put environmental protection and sustainability at the centre of Labor's culture, values and party platform
  - 3. To ensure the Australian Labor Party (ALP) is the leading party of the environment in NSW and Australia

# C. Membership

- C.1 Membership of LEAN is open to all members of the NSW Branch of the ALP
- C.2 Membership of LEAN is open to all residents of NSW who are prepared to accept LEAN's objectives and who have associations with no other Australian political party
- C.3 Members of LEAN must not actively oppose the ALP or the ALP's Official Candidate during an election
- C.4 Individuals who have been expelled from the ALP are ineligible for LEAN Membership

# D. Joining LEAN

- D.1 A person must personally apply to join LEAN by:
  - 1. Completing a membership application form
  - 2. Submitting that form to LEAN (either electronically, in person or via post)
  - 3. Pay any membership fee as determined by the Executive

### E. National affiliation

- E.1 LEAN supports a National LEAN structure for the promotion of LEAN's objectives for Federally related issues and policies.
- E.2 LEAN will contribute to LEAN Nationally by:
  - 1. Appointing delegates or convenors to LEAN Australia
  - 2. Affiliating to LEAN Australia if required
  - 3. Contributing financially to LEAN Australia if required

### F. LEAN Executive

- F.1 The executive of LEAN comprises of
  - 1. A Convenor
  - 2. A LEAN Organiser
  - 3. 5 other Executive members
  - 4. Any NSW based Convenors or Office bearers of the National LEAN Organisation
- F.2 The Executive is empowered to carry out the functions of LEAN between meetings
- F.3 The Convenor and the Organiser be the authorised signatories to LEAN's Bank Account with 'any two' to sign. Other members of the Executive may be authorised as signatories where necessary
- F.4 Only the Executive is authorised to make public statements or issue press releases on behalf of LEAN.
- F.5 The Executive shall maintain the LEAN membership register.

### G. MEETINGS

- G.1 In the spirit of LEAN's aspiration to be a mass voluntary organisation:
  - 1. General meetings of LEAN should only be convened when required
  - 2. Meeting formalities should be less structured and more participatory
  - 3. Meetings should focus on policy formation, education and campaigning activities
  - 4. Meetings should be held at different locations throughout the State
  - 5. It is permissible to hold meetings by teleconference and members are allowed to participate in meetings held by teleconference
  - 6. Meetings are to be chaired by the Convenor or the State Organiser
  - Meeting notification must be provided to members with at least 1 week notice.
    Notification can be provided by email, mail, Facebook event, text message or notice in the Party's Journal
  - 8. Meeting minutes must be recorded, and previous meeting minutes must be available, upon request, at formal LEAN meetings
- G.2 There should be a minimum of two general meetings held in a calendar year, one of which will also be the Annual General Meeting.
- G.3 At the Annual General Meeting:
  - 1. The LEAN Executive should be elected
  - 2. The Patrons and any other positions of LEAN be appointed (such as the National Convenor)
  - 3. The annual accounts be received and approved
  - 4. The rules may be amended
- G.1 LEAN will adopt the ALP's (NSW Branch) Party Rules in relation to the conduct of the meetings in terms of "Rules of Debate" (Currently Schedule H of the NSW Labor Rules)

# H. Policies

- H.1 LEAN may, from time to time, adopt official policies and campaigns that are in accordance with LEAN's objectives.
- H.2 LEAN can actively pursue those policies and campaigns amongst Party members, Parliamentary caucuses, in Party forums (such as conferences) and to the general public.
- H.3 LEAN's official policies and campaigns are not binding on LEAN members. There are no penalties for LEAN members who oppose LEAN's Official Position.
