Q6 In other states that are heavily fracked, such as Colorado and Pennsylvania, where there are hundreds of wells in a single county, the harms of fracking are documented and well-known to residents who are experiencing many health problems. The state of Vermont banned fracking, and the state of New York banned fracking based on concerns about the health impacts. The gas and oil industry has only begun to do deep horizontal fracking in Michigan, with over 50 wells permitted so far. The state also has over 1,000 injection wells, and is a regional center for out-of-state frack wastes. Do you believe Michigan should ban fracking and frack wastes before the industry creates health problems for Michigan residents, or not?
