### Caring is tough

I have just graduated from a six-year Master's, during which I was also an intermittent carer for my mother, so I have firsthand knowledge of how hard it can be to balance caring with both education and work. Young adult carers (aged 16-25) are frequently left behind by traditional carers' support services, and left to fend for themselves during a difficult period of transition in their lives between adolescence and adulthood.

### I want to be YOUR voice

We cannot be fairly represented by the Executive or the party if our voices are not heard, and I am determined to make your voices heard.

I have over two years' experience in representing carers' needs to organisations, as my University's first-ever Carers' Representative for two consecutive years before being co-opted onto the Young Liberals' Diversity Committee.
