## Teaching Position: Senior English

The Linden School invites applications for a full-time intermediate to senior English Teacher, **commencing late September 2017** for a one-year term, with the possibility of renewal.

Candidates shall be certified by and be in good standing with the Ontario College of Teachers, or equivalent. Candidates shall hold successful experience teaching a variety of subjects to a range of age groups, including experience teaching English and, if possible, drama. The successful candidates will demonstrate a sound knowledge of girl-centred pedagogy, feminism and social justice along with demonstrated capacity to work in an atmosphere of collaboration and collegiality and to foster a strong sense of community. Candidates will also be assessed for their experience and capacity to promote the values of equity, diversity, and inclusion in the classroom.

Salary will be commensurate with education and experience.
