ENGAGEMENT

An established network of partners is one of the Emerald Network's biggest strengths.



Connect Local: Through the Greenway Partners Program we will provide 6 community partners with capacitybuilding support to advance a proposed greenway project in 2016-17.

Connect Citywide: The Emerald Network is included in Boston's 2015-2021 Open Space Plan and Green Links, a plan to connect people in every neighborhood to the City's greenway network.



Connect Regional: As a member of the LandLine Coalition, we work with a network of transportation advocacy professionals to promote throughout the Greater Boston region.

PROGRESS

The Emerald Network builds off a portfolio of 100 miles of existing greenways. Of the remaining 100 miles, 30 miles are in-progress and 70 miles are proposed new links. We are actively strengthening partnerships, activating public support, and providing technical assistance to move these projects forward.

Connect Historic Boston (In Construction) Creating safe connectivity in the urban core.




Complete Streets for Comm Ave:
