

The Palaszczuk government's investigation into New Hope Group's New Acland coalmine — which employs 700 people near Toowoomba, 130km

west of Brisbane — comes amid a protracted legal battle over the proposed stage-three extension of the mine.

State Environment Minister Leeanne Enoch confirmed the investigation yesterday.

Separately, activists appealed against a recent Supreme Court decision throwing a lifeline to stage three, which state Labor had previously rejected.

The investigation centres on activists' allegations, rejected by New Acland Coal, that the company had begun mining beyond areas approved by the Environment Department.

The company allegedly expanded "mining activities into ... proposed pits which are within the mining lease area

granted for the mine but outside of the mine pit footprint for which NAC sought and obtained approval", according to a legal brief prepared by the Environmental Defenders Office for the Oakey Coal Action Alliance. "NAC has continued to mine outside the areas approved ... causing environmental harm and/or nuisance to nearby residents. This raises serious concerns as to the financial assurance held for the site."

The legal brief, seen by *The Australian*, was sent to Ms Enoch on May 4 and included aerial photographs purportedly showing the company's suspicious earthworks and land-clearing.

New Hope's spokeswoman denied the company had acted unlawfully.

"New Hope find it generally disappointing that Oakey Coal Action Alliance — with the support of the Environmental Defenders Office — after being unsuccessful in the judicial review proceedings, are now bypassing the Land Court and remaining statutory processes in an attempt to stop the project," she said.

The Court of Appeal case, filed in Brisbane yesterday, argued that judge Helen Bowskill was wrong to find that the Land Court had overstepped its jurisdiction when considering the impact on groundwater of the stage-three extension.

Infringement Notice QXXXXXXXXXXX issued for contravention of section 290 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994.*

The Department of Environment and Science (the department) recently conducted an investigation into an alleged contravention of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* (the Act) for New Acland Coal Pty Ltd's at the New Acland Coal Mine located on ML50170 and ML50216 under environmental authority (EA) EPML00335713.

Under section 290 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* (the Act), it is an offence for an environmental authority holder to fail to comply with a plan of operations. The maximum penalty under the Act that may be imposed for this offence is 500 penalty units, totalling \$63,075 for a corporation.

In relation to the alleged offence, the department has determined that New Acland Coal Pty Ltd has failed to comply with the 2017 – 2018 Plan of Operations (dated June 2017). The department has determined that exploration activities to the east of the current mine pits are outside of the disturbance footprint detailed in the June 2017 plan of operations.

The department has determined that the facts and circumstances of the alleged offences warrant the issuing of one penalty infringement notice (PIN) as an alternative to proceeding by way of prosecution in court.

Please find enclosed one PINs issued to you in the amount of \$3,153.00.

Within 28 days, please:

- pay the amount on the PINs; or
- elect to have the matter heard in court.

This is a PIN recommendation for a breach of s290 of the EP Act- 'The EA holder must, when carrying out an activity under the relevant lease, comply with the plan of operations' for New Acland Coal Pty Ltd for New Acland Coal Mine.

- New Acland Coal Mine is operated by New Acland Coal Pty Ltd (NCA) and is located approx. 130km west of Brisbane.
- The mine is surrounded by agricultural land uses, coal mines and coal seam gas operations.
- NAC are currently operating Stage 2 of the mine, with the Stage 3 expansion the subject of court proceedings.
- As a result of the current delay in approvals for the Stage 3 expansion, NCA have indicated that extraction will be increased to meet existing contracts until a determination is made in relation to Stage 3.
- DES has received numerous community concerns from residents and EDO (on behalf of the Oakey Coal Action Alliance) about the mine, including on 15 February 2018 which outlined allegations of non-compliance with plans of operations (PoO) and disturbance that was not assessed for impacts under the Stage 2 EIS.
- This CAR concentrates on the allegations of non-compliance with the PoO. The EIS disturbance footprint issue is being investigated as a separate matter.
- In June 2017, NAC submitted a PoO for the period 1 August 2017 to 31 July 2018. The PoO was amended on 26 March 2018 (to include an additional clean coal stockpile on ML50216), but still covers the same time period. The compliance centre has utilised the PoO submitted in June 2017 for the CAR as it was in place during the initial investigations into the allegations.
- The PoO states on page 9 'continued exploration drilling activities' will be conducted under the current PoO. Page 59 of the PoO states 'Plans of the actual and estimated areas of disturbance and rehabilitation at the start and end of the current PO are shown in Figure 8-2 to Figure 8-4.'
- Figure 8-4 of the is a map titled 'Predicted areas of disturbance for July 2018 at June 2017'. This figure does not include any details of the location of the 'continued exploration drilling activities'.

- On 28 March 2018, DES requested information from NAC in relation to the allegations of non-compliance with the PoO submitted for the period 1 August 2017 to 31 July 2018.
- The information requested included an explanation of disturbance visible in satellite imagery (dated August and October 2017) and a KMZ or shapefile which details location of all exploration activities (including rehabilitation activities of exploration disturbance) undertaken since July 2017.
- NAC responded to the information request on 10 April 2018 with the following:
 - o The area of alleged disturbance in the satellite imagery is a network of exploration drilling locations conducted by NAC to identify coal reserves across the MLs.
 - o Details of exploration activity locations, including bores that have been drilled, bore sites that have been prepped but not yet drilled and bores that have been rehabilitated.

PART 12-GENERAL PROVISIONS

Division 1⁻Plan of operations for environmental authority relating to mining lease or petroleum lease
285 Definitions for div 1

This division applies only to mining and petroleum activities.

A plan of operations informs the administering authority as to how the operator intends to meet the conditions of the environmental authority at an operational level. It also sets out detail of the rehabilitation requirements for the land, imposed in performance-based terms by the conditions imposed on the authority, which in turn is used to calculate any required financial assurance (see notes to s 292).

286 Application of div 1

Note the exclusion of eligible ERAs by paragraph (b). The intent is that the holders of these lower level environmental authorities will be required to report on rehabilitation through the annual return (s 308).

287 Plan of operations required before acting under relevant lease

A plan of operations can only be prepared once an authority has issued, so that operational processes for complying with the conditions, and the practical scope of rehabilitation obligations, including those which give rise to a security requirement, can be formulated.

There is no approval decision, as such, for a plan of operations, but activities cannot be commenced under an authority until a plan complying with s 288 has been submitted. The authority may audit the plan of operations at any time (under s 326) to ensure that it meets the content requirements.

Under s 292, an operator cannot commence activities until any required security has been lodged. Since the security amount is calculated on the basis of the plan of operations (for mining and petroleum activities), the rehabilitation provisions in the plan of operations must be considered by the authority in order to calculate the amount of the financial assurance. There will be timing issues here for the holder, and it may wish to submit the plan of operations well in advance of the minimum time period before commencement specified in this section to ensure certainty of the commencement date.

288 Requirements for plan of operations

In relation to subsection (3)(b), the plan of operations is not a separate approval, and it needs to be consistent with the environmental authority. If the operator comes to a view in preparing the plan that it needs to carry out operations in a way that is inconsistent with the environmental authority, it must seek an amendment to the environmental authority, and then submit a new plan of operations demonstrating full compliance with the applicable conditions.

The plan of operations must be updated and resubmitted at least every 5 years.

289 Amending or replacing plan

A plan may be amended, but that does not restart the 5 year period under s 288. It may also be replaced, which does restart that period.

290 Failure to comply with plan of operations

Note that this is a separate offence from failing to comply with conditions of an authority (s 430), but there is likely to be overlap in practice, and prosecutors will need to take care not to charge under both sections for what is in substance the same offence.

The penalty under this section is much lower than that under s 430. This reflects a view that the plan is a "management document" rather than an approval as such, which is correct in terms of the legislative structure, but that does not detract from the practical point that a given contravention may well be a breach of the conditions of the authority as well as a contravention of the requirement of the plan.

291 Environmental authority overrides plan

If there is any inconsistency between an environmental authority and a relevant plan of operations, the conditions of the environmental authority prevail to the extent of any inconsistency with the plan, and the plan must be amended to remove the inconsistency.

An inconsistency would be unintended, as the purpose of the plan is to demonstrate how the conditions are to be complied with operationally (s 288(1)(c)).

• One (1) Penalty Infringement Notice (PIN) for the amount of \$3153 is to be issued to New Acland Coal Pty Ltd under s290 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*, for failing to comply with plan of operations.

CUSTOMER DETAILS:

- New Acland Coal Pty Ltd.
- New Acland Coal Mine (ML50170 and ML50216).
- Environmental Authority (EA) EPML00335713.

SUMMARY OF ISSUE/S:

- The Department of Environment and Science (the department) will issue one (1) PIN to New Acland Coal Pty Ltd (NAC) on 27 June 2018 for contravention of section 290 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* (the Act).
- NAC holds EA EPML00335713 for the New Acland Coal Mine, located approximately 130 kilometres west of Brisbane.
- The department has received numerous community concerns from residents and environmental groups, including the Environmental Defenders Office (EDO) regarding allegations of non-compliance, including:
 - expanding mining activities outside of the disturbance footprint that was assessed and approved for Stage 2 of the mine;
 - inconsistency between the EA and the plan of operations (PoO) for the period 1 August 2017 and 31 July 2018;
 - exceeding noise limits; and
 - non-compliance with the PoO for the period 1 August 2017 and 31 July 2018.
- In June 2017, NAC submitted a (PoO) for the period 1 August 2017 to 31 July 2018 to the department. The PoO does not detail the predicted areas of disturbance for exploration activities and only states that continued exploration drilling activities will be conducted under the current PoO.
- On 15 February 2018, the department received a community concern related to exploration activities being conducted at New Acland Coal Mine.
- On 28 March 2018, the department requested information in relation to exploration drilling activities on ML50170 and ML50216, in response to the community concern received.

- The information requested included an explanation of disturbance visible in satellite imagery dated August 2017 and October 2017.
- NAC responded to the request stating that the area of alleged disturbance in the satellite imagery is a network of exploration drilling locations conducted by NAC to identify coal reserves across the MLs.
- On 20 April 2018, the department conducted an inspection to the site and confirmed that exploration drilling activities are occurring outside of the predicted areas of disturbance as detailed in the PoO.
- NAC has contravened section 290 of the Act by failing to comply with the plan of operations when carrying out an activity
 under the relevant lease.
- One PIN for the amount of \$3253 will be issued for contravention of section 290 of the Act.

POTENTIAL IMPACTS / RISKS:

- There is a high level of public concern regarding alleged unauthorised disturbance at New Acland Coal Mine.
- The department has received community reports concerning noise, dust, vibration and blast fume impacts from adjacent landholders
- Stage 3 of the New Acland Coal Mine Expansion Project has been remitted back to the Land Court for further consideration following a judicial review in May 2018.
- Any enforcement action issued to NAC may result in increased public and media interest.
- NAC representatives may contact senior departmental executives regarding the decision to issue a PIN and may contest the
 decision in court.

CUSTOMER ACTIONS:

- NAC have previously indicated that extraction will be increased to meet existing contracts until a determination is made in relation to the Stage 3 expansion approval. This includes undertaking activities (blasting, loading and transportation of coal and overburden) in additional areas up to within 200m of a nearby sensitive receptors (adjacent landholders).
- NAC have advised that between 1 August 2017 and 26 March 2018, exploration activities on ML50170 and ML50216 included:
 - o 27 drill sites drilled;
 - o 27 drill sites rehabilitated; and
 - o 41 drill sites were prepped but not drilled.

DEPARTMENT ACTIONS:

On 26 April 2018, the department issued NAC with a pre-enforcement letter in relation to the alleged offence.

On 20 June 2018, the department received advice from Litigation in regards to the interpretation of section 290 of the Act.

• Investigations are continuing in relation to the alleged unauthorised mining activities being conducted outside of the disturbance footprint approved for Stage 2 of the mine.

PLANNED ACTIONS

- The Compliance Centre will advise NAC on 26 June 2018 of the decision to issue the PIN.
- One (1) PIN will be issued by the Manager (Compliance) to New Acland Coal Pty Ltd on 27 June 2018.
- The department will be conducting noise monitoring at sensitive receptors in June 2018, when conditions are most conducive to noise impacts.
- The department has implemented a risk assessment process to determine when it is likely a blast may cause concerns at sensitive receptors (based on wind direction, wind speed and proximity of blast) and will deploy officers to attend during the relevant blasting event.

KEY COMMUNICATION MESSAGES:

- The issue of one (1) PIN to NAC is an appropriate and proportionate enforcement action for the nature of the offence.
- The department will respond to any non-compliances in accordance with the department's Enforcement Guidelines.

Date of alleged offence:	10 August 2017 to 28 June 2018. Information submitted by NAC for exploration holes drilled from 1 August 2017, indicates the first exploration hole was drilled on 10 August 2017. The current PoO still does not incorporate the disturbance from the exploration drilling activities so the offence is considered to be continuing.				

Date DES aware:	DES conducted an inspection and confirmed the disturbance on 20 April 2018.
Offence description:	EPA48 – s290 Fail to comply with plan of operations – Corporation (\$3153)

Background and review details:

Background

- New Acland Coal Mine is operated by New Acland Coal Pty Ltd (NCA) and is located approx. 130km west of Brisbane.
- The mine is surrounded by agricultural land uses, coal mines and coal seam gas operations.
- NAC are currently operating Stage 2 of the mine, with the Stage 3 expansion the subject of court proceedings.
- As a result of the current delay in approvals for the Stage 3 expansion, NCA have indicated that
 extraction will be increased to meet existing contracts until a determination is made in relation to Stage
 3.
- DES has received numerous community concerns from residents and EDO (on behalf of the Oakey Coal Action Alliance) about the mine, including on 15 February 2018 which outlined allegations of noncompliance with plans of operations (PoO) and disturbance that was not assessed for impacts under the Stage 2 EIS.
- In June 2017, NAC submitted a PoO for the period 1 August 2017 to 31 July 2018. The PoO was amended on 26 March 2018 (to include an additional clean coal stockpile on ML50216), but still covers the same time period. The compliance centre has utilised the PoO submitted in June 2017 for the CAR as it was in place during the initial investigations into the allegations.
- The PoO states on page 9 'continued exploration drilling activities' will be conducted under the current PoO. Page 59 of the PoO states 'Plans of the actual and estimated areas of disturbance and rehabilitation at the start and end of the current PO are shown in Figure 8-2 to Figure 8-4.'
- Figure 8-4 of the PoO is a map titled 'Predicted areas of disturbance for July 2018 at June 2017'. This figure does not include any details of the location of the 'continued exploration drilling activities'.
- Section 288 (1)(c)(i) states a PoO must include a plan showing where all activities are to be carried out on the land.
- On 28 March 2018, DES requested information from NAC in relation to the allegations of non-compliance with the PoO submitted for the period 1 August 2017 to 31 July 2018.
- The information requested included an explanation of disturbance visible in satellite imagery (dated August and October 2017) and a KMZ or shape file which details location of all exploration activities (including rehabilitation activities of exploration disturbance) undertaken since July 2017.
- NAC responded to the information request on 10 April 2018 with the following:
 - The area of alleged disturbance in the satellite imagery is a network of exploration drilling locations conducted by NAC to identify coal reserves across the MLs.
 - Details of exploration activity locations, including bores that have been drilled, bore sites that have been prepped but not yet drilled and bores that have been rehabilitated.
- DES conducted an inspection to the site on 20 April 2018 and confirmed that exploration activities were occurring outside of the predicted areas of disturbance detailed in the PoO.
- A mix of recently drilled, prepped and rehabilitated sites were inspected. Officers observed that some of the rehabilitated bore holes still had the sump visible and drill casings protruding from the ground.
- NAC provided further information on 28 May 2018 which indicted that between 1 August 2017 and 26 March 2018:
 - o 27 drill sites had been rehabilitated
 - o 27 drill sites were drilled; and

- o 41 drill sites were prepped but not drilled.
- As the disturbance for the exploration activities conducted was not included in the predicted areas of disturbance in the PoO, it is alleged NAC are in contravention of s290 of the EP Act- 'The EA holder must, when carrying out an activity under the relevant lease, comply with the plan of operations.'
- The assessment of the amount of financial assurance to be held for the site also did not include the exploration disturbance, as it was not included in the PoO.
- NAC provided a response to the pre-enforcement letter which included numerous statements including:
 - There's no need for exploration drilling activities to be identified in Figure 8-3 nor Figure 8-4 due
 to the comparably insignificant disturbance associated with exploration drilling activities
 compared to those of the authorised ERAs (mining black coal and mineral processing) which
 warrant a higher level of detail.
 - It is not necessary or practical to identify exploration-drilling activities on Figure 8-4 when exploration is clearly identified elsewhere in the PoO as an activity that will be conducted.
 - It's self-evident that exploration would occur in areas of the ML outside of the main pit and infrastructure areas.
 -it is an overly restrictive and pedantic interpretation to require exploration-drilling activities to be located on a drawing within the PoO.
- The CAR states the offence date range as 1 August 2018 until 26 March 2018 (when an amended PoO) was submitted. But as the amended PoO also did not include the exploration activities in the predicted areas of disturbance, I consider it to be a continuing offence.
- I'm happy with the elements in the CAR as it outlines that authorised mining activities under the Mineral Resources Act 1989 includes exploration drilling activities, and as a result, meets the definition of a 'mining activity' in the EP Act.

Infringement Notice Q200000040196932 issued for contravention of section 290 of the Environmental Protection Act 1994.

The Department of Environment and Science (the department) recently conducted an investigation into an alleged contravention of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* (the Act) for New Acland Coal Pty Ltd.'s at the New Acland Coal Mine located on ML50170 and ML50216 under environmental authority (EA) EPML00335713.

Under section 290 of the Act, it is an offence for an EA holder to fail to comply with a plan of operations. The maximum penalty under the Act that may be imposed for this offence is 500 penalty units, totalling \$63,075 for a corporation.

In relation to the alleged offence, the department has determined that New Acland Coal Pty Ltd has failed to comply with the 2017 – 2018 plan of operations by conducting exploration-drilling activities outside of the predicted areas of disturbance detailed within the plan of operations.

The department has determined that the facts and circumstances of the alleged offence warrant the issuing of one penalty infringement notice (PIN) as an alternative to proceeding by way of prosecution in court.

Please find enclosed **one** PIN issued to you in the amount of \$3,153.00.

Within 28 days, please:

- · pay the amount on the PINs; or
- elect to have the matter heard in court.
