It has been a busy three months since the new year started here at the LPCO Headquarters. First off, I would like to thank everyone who helped with the numerous campaigns as well as all of our 2006 candidates. We had the opportunity to shine in several televised debates due to the performance of our gubernatorial candidate and the diligence of several dedicated volunteers (Debbie, we owe you a lot).

We had a marginal success ratio at the ballot box but gained a surprising number of supporters at the capitol. As we look forward to 2007 and beyond, we are continuing to focus on Libertarian legislation and small, winnable campaigns. The 2008 National Libertarian Party Convention will be held in Denver, and we are going to show the nation what the LPCO can

The Little Party That Could

Just about anyone can instantly recall the moral of the classic children's tale about the little engine that struggled to get a train of loaded cars over a steep hill. As it toiled all the way up the hill, the only thing the engine said to itself over and over was "I think I can, I think I can..." A lesson in the power of believing in oneself.

But do you remember how the little engine got involved?

The original engine pulling

the train broke down, and the toys that were loaded in the cars went to one big locomotive after another and were refused with one excuse after another, until they met the little engine that was willing to help.

At some point in your past, you realized that there was a breakdown political our system and that the promises of freedom, peace, and prosperity that our country's founders fought to bring about may no longer be delivered. If voter turnout is any indication, half our population has given up and only

has excuses for not being involved. But something made you believe a solution is still possible, and so you joined the Libertarian Party. We think we can.

Now we've come to the steep hill in the story, and the way we climb it is by registering one Libertarian at at time, fighting one tax increase at a time, winning one election at a time. We stay in it for the long haul. We rework our personal budgets to regularly contribute a percentage of our income. We set aside time on our calendars to regularly volunteer to do outreach, campaigns, and other activism. The fact is, a one percent change in Libertarians' lives (measured by time and money) will result in a 100% change in the political landscape in as few as eight to ten years. We think we can.

five initiatives on the ballot. That makes us the equivalent of one state legislator. If every one of us contributed \$20 and spent another 4 to 8 hours in 2007, we could register more than 25,000 other libertarian-minded people into the party, and we would be five times as strong in 2008. We think we can.

If every one of us gave 1% of our income (about \$240 per capita), then the Libertarian Party would have an annual revenue of about 1.5 million dollars (more if we keep growing), and by 2010 we could easily go toe-to-toe with Ritter's re-election machine and probably win a number

a small army battalion. We think we can.


The War of Independence ran from the formation of George Washington's Continental Army starting in 1775 and ended with the Treaty of Paris in 1783. In the same amount of time, we could easily become a major party in Colorado and realize the promises of freedom, peace and prosperity for ourselves, just as the founding fathers did, but with just a fraction of their sacrifice. The catch is YOU have to get involved! If you wait for someone to give you your freedom, you will wait, and wait, and wait. If

you work to claim your freedom, you will win.

Are you ready to make good on your original motivation for becoming Libertarian? **Figure** out what percentage of money and time you can afford each year. If it's less than 1%, that's ok. If it's more, great! Any number greater than zero is acceptable. Just make the necessary arrangements follow through. Bear with us as we scramble to put the required infrastructure in place. There will be growing pains, but that's better than the pain of growing Don't burn tyranny. out - get your friends

and family to support you.

And soon enough, we'll be cheering – We thought we could! We thought we could!


