## **Appendix A**

### **The Libertarian Party of Connecticut stands against the Biden Vaccine Mandate**

Be it resolved that the Libertarian Party of Connecticut calls upon the Biden Administration to immediately repeal its vaccine mandate plan and calls upon the Supreme Court of the United States and all lower courts to strike down all aspects of this plan immediately on the grounds that it is an unconstitutional interference with the American right to liberty and to freely choose one's own healthcare decisions, that it is an assault upon the autonomy of the individual, that it misuses OSHA to unconstitutionally seize control of private business and force them to impose vaccine mandates without any valid legal basis for doing so, and that it represents a giant step towards socialized medicine in the United States, which will drive up prices and lower quality for millions of vulnerable Americans.

Be it further resolved that the Libertarian Party of Connecticut calls for immediate and widespread peaceful disobedience to any ongoing government COVID mandates, whether on the federal, state, or municipal level, using the Jeffersonian principle of nullification, the Madisonian principle of interposition, and the Thoreau principle of civil disobedience.
