Yes, the People of Massachusetts have spoken up on Fathers' Rights. Every two years, we elect our state legislature, At the same time, voters can be presented with Public Policy Questions, local referenda that do not have the force of law but that do make clear where the people stand. Every time the people have voted, they've voted overwhelmingly in favor of Father's Rights.

It's time for a change. It's time to advance the Fathers' Rights agenda. How can you help do that?

Path 1: More Public Policy Questions. You can make sure: When your Representative and Senator go to the polls, they should be confronted with a Fathers' Rights vote. You and your friends can do them that, right in your own district. Come Summer 2016, you can collect the signatures needed to put a Fathers' Rights Question on the ballot in your district.

Path 2: Support the political party that supports Fathers Rights and equality before the law. That's the Libertarian Party (<http://LPMass.org>) You can be sure. If you support Father's Rights, supporting the Democrats and Republicans will get you nothing. They had their chance to stand up for Fathers' Rights. They didn't. R
