Nominees for Director positions should be knowledgeable about water, water issues, and their sector or organization's use of water. They should be able to bring forward the interests of the sector or organization they are representing while working creatively and constructively with the diverse group of board members, following a consensus based decision making approach.

Directors must commit their time to attending monthly LSWC meetings and committee and planning meetings as required. Local, provincial and Indigenous governments self-select their board members through their own processes. These members are held to the same standard of accountability as generally elected members and need to complete this Nomination form for administrative purposes.
