

COMMUNICATE

Once an official or a representative has been elected, let him or her know by telephone, letter or email how you feel about issues or legislation.

Address official correctly.

Be polite but brief.

State your position on the subject clearly.

Request action. Ask for an answer.

Express thanks for favorable votes.

Compliment better speeches.

VOTING IN BALTIMORE

To vote you must register. You may register to vote in Baltimore if you are a U.S. Citizen who resides in Baltimore and if you are at least 16 years old but you cannot vote unless you will be at least 18 years old by the next general election. Voter Registration Applications are available online at www.elections.state.md.us or at all post offices, any office of the Motor Vehicle Administration, other State agencies, and the Board of Election Supervisors, 417 E. Fayette Street, or the League of Women Voters, 6600 York Road, Suite 211. If you have a valid Maryland-issued state ID number or driver's license number, you may register online. Beginning in 2016, you can register to vote at an early voting site during early voting, and you will be able to vote in that election.

After you register, you will receive by mail a Voter Notification Card which will show your precinct number and polling place. You can also check your voter registration online. You must always vote in the polling place for your precinct, unless you vote at an early voting site.

Any registered voter may vote by absentee ballot. To request an absentee ballot you must first complete an Absentee Ballot Application. During an election season, absentee ballots are available via the internet from the State Board of Election website <http://www.elections.state.md.us/>. They are also available at the Board of Elections, 417 E. Fayette Street, Baltimore, Maryland by calling (410-396-5574), writing or going in person to the Board of Elections. Your request for an Absentee Ballot must be received at the Board of Elections no later than seven days before an election. After that, you must complete the application at the Board of Elections.

- HOW?** By publishing non-partisan information on all candidates, registration and voting information, and material on selected governmental issues, on the local, state and national levels.

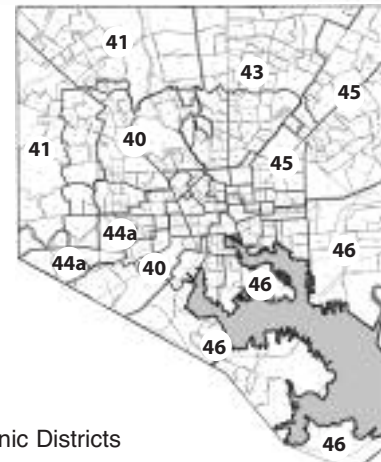

MAPS OF BALTIMORE CITY

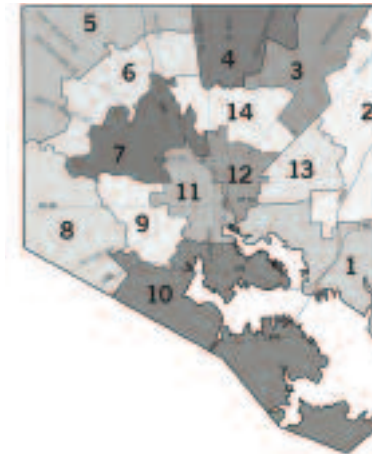
Congressional Districts



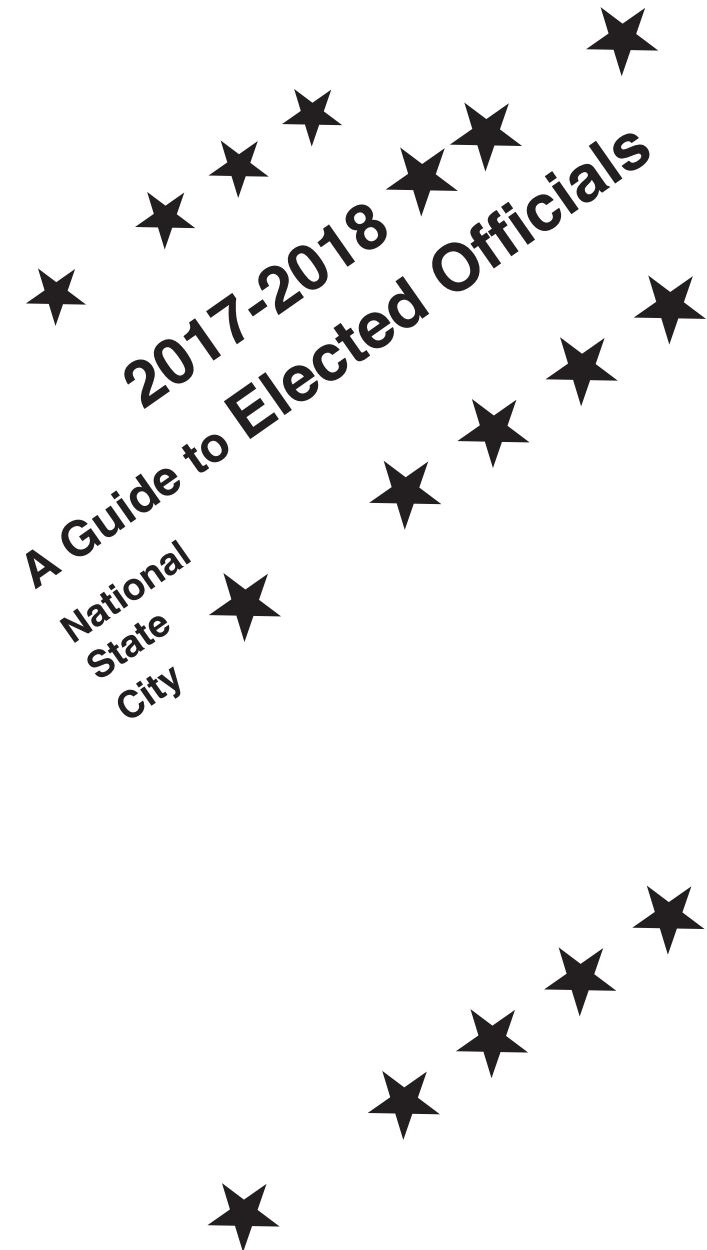
Legislative Districts
