

FEDERAL OFFICES

U.S. PRESIDENT

Duties: The President is the head of state of the United States of America and is the Chief Executive Officer and the Commander in Chief of all military forces. The powers of the President are described in the Constitution and federal law. Subject to Senate approval, the President appoints the members of the Cabinet, ambassadors to other nations and the United Nations, Supreme Court Justices and federal judges. The President, along with the Cabinet and its agencies, is responsible for carrying out and enforcing the laws of the United States. The President may also recommend legislation to the United States Congress.

How Elected: Every four years, political parties nominate candidates to run for President of the United States in a general election that is held on the first Tuesday, after the first Monday in November. Although all parties use conventions to nominate their candidates, in most states the Democratic and Republican parties also run state-wide primary elections or caucuses. The results of the primary influence how the delegates to their respective party's convention will cast ballots for candidates for President. The degree to which the result of the primary influences the votes of delegates at conventions varies from state to state.

Base Salary: \$400,000 per year

Term: Four years. Limit of two terms.

- **Ground Rules:** All qualified presidential candidates were invited to provide biographical information and responses to five specific questions. Candidates qualified if they met the following criteria: 1. The candidate must have made a public announcement of her/his intention to run for her/his Party's nomination for President; and, 2. The candidate must meet the Presidential Election Campaign Fund Act's minimum contribution threshold requirements for qualifying for matching funds, based on the most recent data publicly available on the FEC website.
 - Responses were limited to 400 characters and were truncated thereafter.
 - If a candidate did not respond by the date of publication, "Candidate has not responded." is printed.

- Q:** How do you propose to address the most important challenges facing our country?

- Q:** How do you propose to address the most important challenges facing our country?
A: I have laid out four fights to face our greatest challenges: we must create an economy that raises pay and creates good jobs, ensuring those at the top pay their fair share. We have to support families by expanding access to health care and other vital services. We must maintain our leadership for global peace and security. Finally, we must stop the flow of secret money that corrupts our politics.
- Q:** In building a vibrant U.S. economy, would you emphasize helping companies expand and earn more or addressing income inequality?
A: The deck is stacked against ordinary Americans. That is why I have laid out plans to raise the minimum wage and to close unfair tax loopholes that benefit companies that shift jobs overseas. I will make investments that create jobs, including in infrastructure, research, and education. I'll fight for equal pay, paid leave, and lower taxes for working Americans—asking those at the top to pay more.

A: We have to shut down ISIS recruitment in the U.S. and stop foreign terrorists from coming here. We must disrupt plots before they are carried out by ensuring local law enforcement works with national counterterrorism experts. We must build on our successes in securing loose nuclear materials and other WMD. And we need to empower American Muslims, who are key to the fight against radicalization.

- Q:** Please explain why you do or do not think it is important to reduce the role of money in American elections.
A: Campaign finance reform is needed to restore a government of, by, and for the people—not just the wealthy and well-connected. On issues from climate change to equal pay, Washington won't work for us unless we address the outsized role of money in politics. As president, I will appoint Supreme Court justices who value our right to vote—and I will work to end secret, unaccountable money in politics.

- Q:** How do you propose to address the most important challenges facing our country?
A: I will address the most important challenges

facing our country by bringing people together to reinvigorate democracy. Middle class and working families and low income people. White, Black, Hispanic, and Native American. Men and women. Straight and gay. Native born and immigrant. This is the only way to address the major economic, political, social, and environmental challenges facing our country.

Q: In building a vibrant U.S. economy, would you emphasize helping companies expand and earn more or addressing income inequality?

A: To rebuild the middle class and reduce income and wealth inequality, we must unlock the economic potential of all Americans. How Elected: In 2016, Maryland voters will elect one Senator. Voters elect two Senators from each State who serve six years. About one-third of the 100 members of the Senate is elected every two years. Senators must be at least 30 years old, have been citizens of the United States at least 9 years and be residents of the state they want to represent.

- 2. Employer-sponsored apprentices would gain access to valuable on-the-job training, "earn while they learn" and avoid costly vocational training schools.

DUTIES: The Board of Education of Howard County is responsible for setting local education policy consistent with state and federal laws governing public education. At the direction of the Board, the Superintendent and the school system's administrative staff develop procedures and administrative regulations to support policy decisions. The Board is composed of seven members elected at-large for four-year terms, and a student member elected by students for a one-year term.

SALARY: \$15,000 chair, \$12,000 individual

TERM: 4 years, no term limit

HOW ELECTED: Elected countywide

QUESTIONS

- 1) What qualifications and experience do you that qualify you for a position on the Board of Education?**

- 1. QUALIFICATIONS:** I have served on HCPSS policy charter committees, participated in various community groups in the Elkridge area, and have been an active advocate for public education in Howard County. I have experience in government contracting and client service as well. I bring a different perspective as a current college student and the most recent graduate of the HCPSS of all of the candidates.
- 2. PRIORITY ISSUES:** The Board needs to work on its relationship with educators and provide them with the support and compensation they deserve. It needs to work on respecting the values of the community as well. We need to focus on working to close the achievement and discipline gaps as the diversity of our school system grows. We will also have to work on building adequate facilities as our county grows.
- 3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA):** We won't see major changes in the classroom with ESSA. ESSA will require HCPSS to put plans in place to help low income and minority students who are falling behind. However, we tend to evaluate student progress using test scores, and that has proven to be ineffective and harmful. The administration of these accountability measures is being moved to the state level, but the testing will remain.
- 4. SUSPENSIONS DATA:** In the HCPSS, African-American and Latino students are seven times more likely to be suspended than their white peers. We have a major discipline gap. The HCPSS must closely monitor suspension data based on demographics at each school and make it public. We need to set procedures in place to

investigate instances of discrimination in student discipline. I also favor alternative discipline options.

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: As a Board member, I will be responsive to the community's concerns. I will raise all concerns with HCPSS administration, and follow through until they're resolved. Many on the current Board are failing in this regard. The Board needs to share vital information with the community and provide oversight of the Superintendent's responsibility to deal with the evolving challenges facing the HCPSS.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: While we may not be able to provide computers to every student to keep in their home, we need to improve the current B.Y.O.D. policy to allow students that do not have devices to access computers during and after their day at school. All students deserve the same learning experience, and technology is an important factor. We should consider providing tablets and laptops for all classwork use.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: This is an issue of responsibility to the public. Board members were contacted about this issue and failed to respond to the public's concerns. Each Board member needs to be a point-of-contact for community concerns, and if it relates to the health of students or staff, it needs to be dealt with quickly and competently. The Board needs to provide oversight of the administration's performance.

Marcelino Michael Bedolla

- 1. QUALIFICATIONS:** Retired Drug Enforcement Administration. Teacher in Baltimore City. Worked with Conexiones in its' early years, I served on the OBRC, Equity Council and various school policy committees. My three children went through the school system, two with IEPs and I have a granddaughter in the 8th grade. I bring common sense, will ask questions, have managerial experience and want the best for all student
- 2. PRIORITY ISSUES:** Cyber bullying is huge & not adequately addressed. School maintenance and security, issues of diversity, lack of verbal communication skills for students are only a few of the important issues the Board will face, hopefully with common sense. These and the lack of transparency, loss of confidence by the community and political leaders are issues Board must face.
- 3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA):** Additional staff in elementary grades to support smaller classes with a teacher and a para-educator in the lower grades, more experienced teachers in schools with high a FARM enrollment. To be fair, placement testing for English Language Learners be done in native language or after English proficiency is attained. Additional resources for English Language Learners where needed.
- 4. SUSPENSIONS DATA:** Ask the Superintendent to task the individual schools to timely inform the parent or guardian and to list this data, by the categories' listed above with no names on the schools profile under the heading: MSDE Individual School Performance Report or the individual schools profile and require the school system to aggregate the data by elementary, middle and high schools.
- 5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS:** There is a breakdown in communications system wide that needs to be repaired. I'd support an open door policy particularly at the school level but also at the main office for community members and stakeholders. I'd encourage the PTA at the school and the principal to hold town hall type meetings with Board members and main office staff on common concerns and complaints and open to the community.
- 6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES:** The school system needs to develop partnerships with the Library to provide a dedicated area and time frame only for students to utilize their computers and with big box stores to donate computers for use by homeless students, of which in FY 2014-15 there were 470 in the system, Partnerships with the business community and County Office's is one way to address this inequity. Or is BYOD too much?
- 7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES:** Hold the Superintendent responsible for insuring

that: every building utilized by students or staff is inspected regularly for environmental hazards; maintenance schedules are kept and documented; updated equipment is compatible with infrastructure already in place; procedures are in place to inform the public and pre-selected locations are available to continue the delivery of instruction.

Kirsten Coombs

1. QUALIFICATIONS: I have been a volunteer in several capacities at my daughter's schools. I worked on the Citizens' Operating Budget Review Committee (COBRC) in Spring 2015. I have a BS in Accounting and used my financial skills to analyze the budget and present the committee's findings to stakeholders. I also have a BA in History and an MBA in International Business, so I appreciate educating the whole child.

2. PRIORITY ISSUES: My priorities are: Providing oversight of the superintendent; Adequate staffing & resources for a growing student population; Building maintenance & upkeep in a proactive manner to avoid issues such as mold and failing roofs; Addressing decreased morale among educators and staff to make sure we're attracting & retaining high-quality staff; and, Implementing new programs in a thoughtful manner.

3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA): HCPSS needs to continue to ensure that low-income and minority students have high quality educators. I feel my background in accounting will help with ESSA compliance, as the Act addresses the need for transparency in budgeting. School-level financial information should be made available so that taxpayers know what the funding sources are and where they are going.

4. SUSPENSIONS DATA: In general, all MPIA requests should be tracked, logged and reviewed by the Board on a periodic basis for responsiveness. In particular, HCPSS should set up a reporting system as soon as possible using Excel or Access to gather this data & have monthly deadlines for administrators to submit. More importantly, though, I would look for solutions – what are we doing to address the disparities?

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: As noted above, all requests should be catalogued and Board members should receive periodic reports on the status, cost and subjects of them. If information is not protected, i.e. student names & health data, the Board could post it to the public website, in addition to providing statistics on requests and their turnaround, to provide complete transparency.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: Obtaining computers for home use should be explored through community and business partnerships. However, the Digital Divide does not just include the physical resource, but the ability to use it at home. HCPSS should work with the County Technology office to provide Internet on the ICBN. High school students could assist with troubleshooting this process and obtain volunteer service hours.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: Board members should be made aware when staff/parents/students notify the administration of facility issues. The Board should require updates on the impact on people and the mitigation/solution of the underlying problem. The Board member for that cluster should be invited to meetings and allowed to stay up to date on a first person basis.

1. QUALIFICATIONS: I have served as parent volunteer for years at my children's schools as well as volunteer youth sports coach and Girls Director of WHC youth basketball. Recent experience advocating for healthy air quality at Glenwood MS inspired me to run for BOE. I learned first hand that the qualities most important for a BOE member are my strengths: ability to communicate, collaborate and advocate.

2. PRIORITY ISSUES: Given the current climate a priority will be building back the trust with stakeholders. Many of the important issues exist because of a lack of transparency and data driven decisions based on collaboration with parents and teachers. In addition, we also need to refocus our energy and budget back into the classroom, doing all we can to support and empower both our educators AND students.

3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA): The new law allows for new state teacher degree granting academies and alternative programs. HCPSS will need to address concerns that these teacher preparation programs are accountable to K-12 student achievement and that all teachers and paraprofessionals working in schools receiving Title I funds meet certification and licensure requirements.

4. SUSPENSION DATA: Public should have access to the raw data, not just the school system's interpretation of the data. I believe that all school system documents, studies, reports should be easily available to the public (with respect to student privacy) Suspension rates, bullying reports, even achievement reports need to be presented in a way that is truthful. Image should match the reality.

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: I would support open forums, town halls throughout the county and reinstatement of the ombudsman program. We should look at ways to streamline how the BOE responds to concerns and ensure adequate followup.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: The media center is a necessary resource for many of our students and decreasing availability by reducing para educators has had a profound effect. For many students, this is the place where they get their homework done and we need to reassess to look for ways to make it more available. Expansion of after school homework clubs and computer labs is another way to address this.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: School board members are the students and staff advocate. They should be reaching out to the community to get information, not rely on facts from central office, the superintendent or other board members. The burden of proof should be on the school system, not the community. BOE members work for the community and have the responsibility to do everything possible to assist their constituents

Ann DeLacy

1. QUALIFICATIONS: As well as having undergraduate and graduate degrees in education, my entire working career has been in the Howard County Public School System. I taught Family and Consumer Science for 30 years in middle schools and 3 years at Mt. Hebron HS. After serving as President of HCEA for 6 years, I retired and was elected to the HCPSS Board Education in 2012. I volunteer weekly in two elementary schools

2. PRIORITY ISSUES: The major challenge facing us will be fiscal. Each student, irrespective of social economic status, ability, or zip code must receive a world class education. These are some initiatives that will be needed: universal PreK, the expansion of World Languages and ESM, greater cultural awareness for our employees, curricula that better reflects our County's ethnic diversity PLUS a comprehensive HS.

3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA): All HCPSS students in Title I schools are taught by highly qualified teachers. The current waivers from the old NCLB law will expire on 8/1/2016. The federal role in public education has been diminished and greater control has given to the state and local Boards. Race to the Top is over but we still have to worry about mandates from the governor appointed state board and the General Assembly

4. SUSPENSIONS DATA: HCPSS provides an annual report to the public on suspensions and access to the Maryland State Board report can be easily accessed through our website. Given the testimonies I have heard recently from many of our students and parents about discriminatory practices and injustices, there must be greater oversight by our administrators. The data must be made more

assessable and be constantly analyzed

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: I believe the New Maryland Public Information Act recently passed strengthens requirements to provide the public with information. A response is required within 10 days. The State has now established a State PIA Compliance Board to resolve disputes over fees over \$350; and has created a new Public Access Ombudsman within the Attorney General's Office to mediate disputes.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: HCPSS provides technology to students who lack access during the school day. Our foundation, the Bright Minds Foundation, can and does work with nonprofits, businesses, and other community partners to provide additional resources. One example is the Comcast Internet Essential program, where some families can receive internet access for \$9.95 per month, low cost computers and free online tutorials.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: BOE members can guide the public to the proper reporting procedures for the newly established Indoor Environmental Quality process (IEQ). HCPSS will hire an IEQ Coordinator. Each building will establish a walk-through team with designated tasks and include classroom-based personnel. Finally, clearly defined communication protocols have been established and must be maintained.

1. QUALIFICATIONS: My 2 children are in HCPSS schools. I served as PTA Council of Howard County president for 3 terms & also on the Operating Budget Review Committee. I worked for the U.S. House of Representatives & have experience leading successful collaborations between stakeholders that I'll bring to the BOE. I'll continue to advocate for complete & accurate information to improve accountability & transparency.

2. PRIORITY ISSUES: Collaborating with parents and the community on key decisions. Meeting the challenges of providing an individualized education to each and every child. The rising costs of education. Facility maintenance and construction needs. Overcrowding in our schools.

3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA): Standards set under the ESSA should be viewed as a floor and not a ceiling and we must continue to set higher standards in HCPSS. We should continue to be a leader in education, and hire and retain exceptional teachers to address every student's unique needs and challenges. HCPSS should support our teachers through meaningful professional development.

4. SUSPENSIONS DATA: I believe that complete and accurate suspension data should be made available at HCPSS.org in a format that provides information to the public, but protects individual privacy. By providing the information, all stakeholders can engage in meaningful discussions and work together towards reducing these incidents.

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: Policies that promote transparency and accountability are important to a well-run organization. Citizens need an easy way to provide input/feedback so we can better meet the education needs of all students. Every person who contacts the BOE with a concern should receive a timely response. I would recommend the BOE implement a 10-day policy for providing responses to citizen inquiries.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: First, identify how many students do not have access at home and then formulate a plan to meet this challenge. Then we can seek public/private partnerships, grants and other avenues to provide access. The BOE should make library media centers more accessible by allowing students to use them outside of school hours and restoring the media secretary positions they eliminated in the FY16 budget.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: The BOE is responsible for ensuring our schools provide a healthy learning environment. If problems arise that could impact health/safety the HCPSS has an obligation to immediately notify parents/staff. When the BOE was informed about the mold issue it became their responsibility to ensure proper steps were taken to inform

parents and remedy the problem in an open and transparent manner.

Mavis Ellis

1. QUALIFICATIONS: My 30 years in education includes being a PTA president, high school administrator, and educational evaluator. Currently, as a Pupil Personnel Worker, I daily advocate for students, their families, school staff, and others in the areas of special education, discipline, and education policy. I represent 70,000 Maryland educators on both National and State Board of Directors (NEA/MSEA).

2. PRIORITY ISSUES: Transparency, communication, and collaboration with all stakeholders and elected officials are key issues that must be addressed by the Board. They also face the issues of our student population becoming more diverse ethnically and economically; the fiscal challenges to our increased enrollments; providing equitable technical education to all; and making many new decisions defined in ESSA.

3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA): In working with Congress to pass ESSA, I learned that the inclusion of classroom teachers in decision-making processes for staff training, school improvement and other issues is key. HCPSS will have to work more collaboratively in the future. Teachers need more professional development is in the areas of cultural competence and about the whole child's social-emotional growth to be effective.

4. SUSPENSIONS DATA: The Maryland State Department of Education requires that data on suspensions be collected by HCPSS for each school. That data may not include sexual identity. However, it should not be a problem to share suspension reports with the public on an annual basis.

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: I believe in transparency, collaboration and oversight for all education stakeholders. I will support policies for citizen participation in the budget process and having independent audits. I will also support creation of a timeline to respond to citizen concerns. Board members should periodically attend community meetings just to listen.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: All students should have access to technology in the classroom on a regular basis. They should also have access to technology after school for doing their homework or projects. Investment in hardware and internet access should be researched for its cost effectiveness. This is a national issue and HCPSS should be able to locate success stories to inform its decision-making on this issue.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: When environmental/health issues are brought to the Board, the Board should go into crisis mode. Some issues will require an immediate/comprehensive response, while others may require a policy-based process. HCPSS staff should be required to investigate, deal with the situation, and update the Board and the community in a timely manner on the status of the problem's resolution.

2. PRIORITY ISSUES: Secure adequate funding - Diversify and grow our workforce - Develop relevant curriculum to prepare students to build their futures - Close the achievement gap - Repair public trust and increase community engagement - Improve access to public information and increase transparency - Expand student opportunities for experience-based learning - Add classrooms to meet continued enrollment growth

3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT

(ESSA): Currently HCPSS meets this ESSA standard. Our responsibility is to ensure that we support teachers with professional development and classroom resources - current and relevant for 21st Century learners - so they remain at the top of their profession. The ultimate objective, however, is to ensure that these students have access to all classes - Honors, GT & AP - in each school and at each level.

4. SUSPENSIONS DATA: All Maryland school systems collect and report suspension data annually to the MD Dept of Education or publication on the MSDE website. HCPSS staff also issues a public report to the Board. Unfortunately, the Board cannot authorize individual reporting of data in some of the areas requested, since these categories are protected under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: Redefine Ombudsman position to better connect the community with information and support. Revise Family Involvement Policy 10000 to include procedures to improve system response to concerns. Promote a simplified process for request and delivery of public information. Expand current Coffee & Conversations to provide additional opportunities for communities to speak directly with the Board.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: Student access is supported by loaned technology in school. Outreach by the BOE's Bright Minds Foundation delivers refurbished computers along with basic instruction to families lacking computer access. Software options to convert surplus HCPSS computers to cloud-based systems would make more hardware available for distribution: partnering with the county to provide WiFi completes the package.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: In response to recent environmental concerns, new Indoor Environmental Quality (IEQ) Procedures, developed with the community are now in place. These cover the monitoring, reporting, investigating and remediation of any issues and communicating the action steps to the public. When informed of any such issue, a Board member should refer the matter to the new HCPSS IEQ Coordinator for investigation.

Robert Wayne Miller

1. QUALIFICATIONS: I recently retired after 34 years of teaching in HCPSS elementary, middle, and high schools. My son and daughter attended HCPSS schools from K-12. I have a BS and M.Ed. in Music Education and a BS in Psychology from UM College Park. My perspective from "inside" and "outside" the school system positions me to prioritize initiatives, anticipate unintended consequences, and enable positive change.

2. PRIORITY ISSUES: Regain community and staff trust; reduce the achievement gap while improving education for all students; comply with ESSA; plan/open new schools & redistrict; increase instructional time by reducing staff time spent on standardized tests and the teacher evaluation protocol; improve compensation; improve special ed. implementation; increase financial efficiency; develop a coherent technology plan.

3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA): HCPSS will need to determine how to identify and address any disparities that result in low-income students and minority students being taught more frequently than other students by ineffective, inexperienced, or out-of-field, teachers. ESSA funds can be used to address the disparities.

4. SUSPENSIONS DATA: I would propose adding a provision to Policy 9200 (Student Discipline) that the number and reasons for suspensions be reported annually by race, gender, disability, and sexual identity, as well as for students in the FARMS (free and reduced-price meals) program and special education program. I would propose posting the report in the Research and Data Analysis section of the HCPSS website.

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: Best practice

would dictate returning all calls, emails, and texts within a 24-hour period. If not possible, contact should be made to confirm receipt and by when further communication can be expected. Full communication should be made within a maximum of three days, and should continue in a similar manner until resolution/closure is reached. US mail contact would be similar plus delivery time.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: For appropriate students, options should include home or local internet access, possibly involving a partnership between HCPSS and a telecom/cable company. For those students, HCPSS could supply tablets/laptops, also investigating partnerships. HCPSS should explore pros/cons of loaning devices to all students who would use them for school as opposed to having students bring their own; then decide.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: Act as an ongoing liaison between community members and appropriate staff members until problems are solved; maintain open, transparent, and honest communication with stakeholders regarding concerns and actions; visit sites when appropriate; allocate funding to rectify issues when appropriate; accommodate needs of stakeholders during remediation, including individuals with special circumstances.

1. 2. PRIORITY ISSUES: Important issues would be restoring Transparency, Accountability & Empathy towards the students, educators and parents. Complying with Every Student Succeeds Act. Brining racial diversity & tolerance at all levels, and addressing the race based disparities in the suspension rates and performance gaps. Reviewing the rigor of our curriculum to ensure our kids are competitive in a global workplace.

3. EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA): By law we would be required to report achievement levels by sub groups to help identify the underperforming groups, and come up with an evidence based plan to address the disparity. We would need to reallocate resources to ensure that these groups perform on par with the rest of the student population or risk the school being taken over by the state.

4. SUSPENSIONS DATA: The main reason for the current lack of data is due to lack of transparency. The Board can collectively direct the Superintendent to release the information subject to privacy laws, and in the event that the information is truly not available with the school system we can start tracking it. Access to information is critical to address any issue.

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: One way to ensure acknowledgement of public concerns is to make it a part of the superintendent's appraisal. We could make this as one of the data points that the school system reports to the BOE and make it public information. Information is power, and highlighting an issue in an objective manner will ensure remedial actions.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: Computers have become very affordable over the past few years. Loaner computers could be made available to the families that do not have access to computers at home. Alternatively computers with minimum essential features could be provided free of cost based on the economic status. The financial impact of this decision would need to be reviewed.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: The community should be notified when it is evident that the basic safety tenets of the school have been violated. The school system should share the information with the parents, failing which the School Board should direct

the Superintendent to share the information on the extent, the root cause and remedial steps. Hiding facts or restricting information is never an solution.

4. SUSPENSIONS DATA: The public should have full access to reported suspension data. As important, is how the data is interpreted and used to make the required changes & necessary improvements. Data must also be used to address the Diversity in our schools & provide training for teachers in helping them make positive changes towards how they approach students in handling challenges in the classroom.

5. CITIZENS' CONCERNS: While Current guidelines are in place for Parental Concerns, awareness seems to be lacking, therefore improvement in responsiveness and accountability is needed. These guidelines should be publicized & streamlined to provide better access through multiple media tools & improve accountability & timely resolution of parental concerns. The Boards Ombudsman can continue to guide and handle disputes.

6. TECHNOLOGY ISSUES: Digital equity is a concern and another area to eliminate gaps. Computer access at home is an issue which needs to be addressed. This can be achieved with continued work with county government, non-profits and community groups in eliminating this gap so a student continues to learn at home. Thanks to Bright Minds, the HCPSS education foundation continues to provide computers to families in need.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: Develop an Indoor Environmental Quality Policy for all existing schools & new construction. Accountability of schools & administration to the guidelines provided. The policy should include dissemination of information to all stakeholders & parents in a cooperative manner where the school system involves the community & interested parties in all phases including planning & information distribution.



CONVENTION DELEGATES

DUTIES: Convention delegates elected in the primary are the people who officially elect their party's Presidential candidate at the national conventions. Presidential nominees are not elected directly by the voters in the primary. Rather, voters in each state choose delegates to represent them at the national conventions.

HOW ELECTED: The **Republican ballot** lists candidates for delegates to the Republican National Convention and the Presidential candidate each one supports. Republican voters in each Maryland congressional district will elect 3 delegates and 3 alternates. The Spring 2016 State Republican Convention will select 11 at-large delegates. Those delegates will go to the Republican National Convention, which will be held July 18 – July 21, 2016 in Cleveland, Ohio.

The **Democratic ballot** lists candidates for delegates to the Democratic National Convention and the Presidential candidate each one supports. Maryland will send 126 delegates to the Democratic National Convention in Philadelphia, PA, July 26 – July 28, 2016. Democratic voters in the Congressional districts will elect 64 delegates. Party rules determine the number of delegates to be elected from each district. The remaining 62 are chosen by the Maryland Democratic Party and consist of 31 appointed party leaders, 23 elected officials, and 8 alternate delegates.


