



## GET OUT THE VOTE FACT SHEET

Anne Arundel County recently announced a [web page](#) designed to be a resource for critical voting information. It contains the full list of voting sites for early voting and on November 3, as well as links to voter registration, mail-in voting instructions, and other important resource information. Voting by mail or by placing your ballot into a secure ballot drop box will help to safeguard your health and alleviate delays at voting sites. However, you may vote in-person both during early voting and on election day.

If you choose to **vote by mail, unlike for the primary election, you will not automatically receive a ballot in the mail. You MUST REQUEST a ballot.** The State Board of Elections plans to send all eligible voters an application for a mail-in ballot around the end of August, however, you don't have to wait. [Click here for an application to request your ballot TODAY](#) and allow ample time to receive the ballot. **The deadline for requesting a ballot is October 20.**

**Important note:** If you request a mail-in ballot and then decide to vote in person, you will have to vote a provisional ballot.

If you choose to **vote in-person**, please take advantage of early voting (October 26 – November 2, 7 a.m. – 8 p.m.). Anne Arundel County will have 7 early voting sites: Arundel High, Crofton Middle, North County High, Northeast High, Pip Moyer Recreation Center, Severna Park High and South River High.

On November 3 election day, there will be 25 voting sites located at Anne Arundel County public schools, plus Pip Moyer Recreation Center (Annapolis), Heritage Community Church (Severn), and Earleigh Heights Volunteer Fire Hall.

Masks and social distancing will be observed at all voting sites.

In addition, the County will provide 29 secure ballot drop boxes, one at each of the 28 voting sites plus one at the Board of Elections office (Glen

Burnie). **Drop boxes** will have 24-hour security and video surveillance and will begin **accepting ballots beginning on October 1**.

**Anne Arundel County citizens who are eligible voters are permitted to vote in-person at any designated County voting site.**
