- 1. Protecting the Vote This could include improving the mail-in voting process, increasing efficiency and accuracy of the voter registration process, opposing attempts to restrict access to voting and increasing transparency in Election Administration
- Campaign Reform This could include public funding for General Assembly Candidates, increasing transparency around who donates to campaigns, efforts to combat on-line fraud about candidates and campaigns.
- 3. Improving the judicial System This could include eliminating contested elections for Circuit Court Judges, improving the bail system, ensuring fair legal representation for all.
- 4. Redistricting Advocating for adoption of Congressional and Legislative District Maps that are fair to voters rather than being drawn for the benefit of parties or elected officials
