

To prepare this resource, the League invites all qualified candidates to participate. Responses appear exactly as entered by the candidate through an online interface. Answers end when the pre-established 400-character limit is reached. Candidates who have not responded by the print deadline (as indicated herein), and those who wish to revise their responses, may do so at any time and their updated information will be accessible to voters on the League's interactive website, Vote411.org. Voters are encouraged to visit <a href=Vote411.org prior to voting for updated responses and candidate photos, as well as information on candidate forums, voting sites and a personalized ballot.

Copies have been distributed to public libraries and other community centers, and are available by request by emailing pres@lwvaacmd.org. Candidate information is current as of March 21, 2016. Frequently Asked Questions About Voting in Maryland

Am I registered to vote?

In Maryland, registration is permanent so long as you keep your current address. To verify that your registration is up-to-date, go to voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/VoterSearch, or call the Board of Elections at (410) 222-6600.

Am I eligible to register to vote?

To register, you must be at least 16 years old, a U.S. citizen and a Maryland resident. You must not be under court-ordered ineligibility to vote due to mental disability, nor convicted of buying or selling votes. If you have been convicted of a felony, you must have completed serving any prison sentence.

How and when can I register, change my party or update my address?

To vote absentee or on Primary Election Day, April 26, the deadline to register to vote or make changes is Tuesday, April 5, at 9 PM. Go to <u>aacounty.org/elections</u> and click "Register to Vote."

You may also register to vote during early voting (April 14-21) at any Anne Arundel County early voting center. Bring a Maryland driver's license, identification card, learner's permit, or other proof of residency. If you are already registered, you may correct your address, but you cannot change your party affiliation during early voting.

Who can vote in the Primary Election?

Registered voters must be at least 18 years of age on or before the General Election, November 8, 2016 to vote in the Primary.

Primaries are closed elections in Maryland. You must be registered as a Republican or **Democrat to vote in your party's primary.**

The Green Party of Maryland is conducting is own primary. Voters who are listed as Green Party members with their Board of Elections may participate. To request a ballot, email marylandgreens@gmail.com.

What Congressional District am I in?

To determine your election district, enter your residential address in <u>Vote411.org</u> or <u>mdelect.net</u>, check your sample ballot or call the Board of Elections (410) 222-6600.

VOTE BY MAIL (ABSENTEE)

Any registered voter may vote by absentee ballot. To request an absentee ballot application, go to aacounty.org/elections and click on "Request an Absentee Ballot," or contact the Board of Elections at (410) 222-6600 or elections@aacounty.org. You may receive the ballot by mail, fax, email or in person, and application deadlines vary accordingly. Details may be found in the sample ballot mailed by the Board of Elections, or at aacounty, org/elections. The completed absentee ballot must be postmarked on or before Primary Election Day, or hand delivered to the County Board of Elections before 8 PM on Primary Election Day, Tuesday, April 26.

VOTE ON PRIMARY ELECTION DAY

Your local assigned polling place will be open from 7 AM to 8 PM on Tuesday, April 26, Primary Election Day. If you are unsure of your assigned polling place, check the back of your sample ballot or go to voterservices.election.maryland.gov/PollingPlaceSearch.

U.S. President

Duties: The President is the head of state of the United States of America and is the Chief Executive Officer and the Commander in Chief of all military forces. The powers of the President are described in the U.S. Constitution and federal law. Subject to Senate approval, the President appoints members of the Cabinet, ambassadors to other nations and the United Nations, Supreme Court Justices and federal judges. The President, along with the Cabinet and its agencies, is responsible for carrying out and enforcing the laws of the United States. The President may also recommend legislation to the United States Congress.

How Elected: Every four years, political parties nominate candidates to run for President of the United States in a general election that is held on the first Tuesday, after the first Monday in November. Although all parties use conventions to nominate their candidates, in most states the Democratic and Republican parties also run state-wide primary elections or caucuses. The results of the primary elections influence how the delegates to their respective party's convention will cast ballots for candidates for President. The degree to which the result of the primary influences the votes of delegates at conventions varies from state to state.

Term: Four years. Limit of two terms.

Salary: \$400,000 per year.

Ground Rules for Inclusion in this Voters' Guide: All qualified presidential candidates were invited to provide biographical information and responses to five specific questions. Candidates qualified if they met the following criteria:

- (1) The candidate must have made a public announcement of her/his intention to run for her/his party's nomination for President;
- (2) The candidate must meet the Presidential Election Campaign Fund Act's minimum contribution threshold requirements for qualifying for matching funds, based on the most recent data publicly available on the FEC website.

Q: How do you propose to address the most important challenges facing our country? I will address the challenges facing the U.S. with strength, resolve and most importantly my faith in God. Already, I've put forth my policy proposals for taxes, education, health care, national security and other issues that we know the next president will face. But we know we'll face challenges we can't foresee. My experience as a surgeon gives me the strength and judgement necessary to lead.

Q: In building a vibrant U.S. economy, would you emphasize helping companies expand and earn more or addressing income inequality?

This is a false dichotomy. Pursuing economic policies that promote the free market, reduce red

tape and increase common sense will help grow America's businesses AND new and higher paying jobs. As president, I will drive companies to reinvest in America, creating policies that reward them for entrepreneurship and creativity, not punish them for success. When hiring increases, so will salaries.

Q: Please explain why you support or oppose using more U.S. military power to resolve the situation in the Middle East.

We cannot defeat ISIS by tying our military's hands. I will deploy U.S. military resources to work with regional partners like Jordan, Iraq, Egypt and Saudi Arabia to destroy ISIS by disrupting its funding and supplies and retaking its territory. As president, I will consult with senior leaders of the military. If they advise that ground troops are necessary, I won't hesitate to deploy them.

Q: What measures do you support to protect Americans from domestic acts of terrorism? First I will fix our broken immigration system. Second, we must work with community leaders to combat radicalization. Third, we must better equip

local and federal law enforcement to investigate plots. Finally, we can't let political correctness stop us from being vigilant.

Q: Please explain why you do or do not think it is important to reduce the role of money in American elections.

I firmly believe that special interests should not dictate American elections. America was designed to serve "We the People," not "They the Powerful". Unlike most candidates, my campaign hasn't been bought by big donors. Big industries just use our broken system to keep the same D.C. insiders in office. We must break that cycle by electing new leaders and reform our campaign finance system.

Q: How do you propose to address the most important challenges facing our country? I think the most important issues facing this country are economic recovery, immigration and

national security. I have proposed an excellent progrowth tax policy, have taken the strongest stance on immigration reform and have addressed how we will recapitalize our military to attain the readiness necessary to achieve and protect our national interests. A strong economy must be first.

Q: In building a vibrant U.S. economy, would you emphasize helping companies expand and earn more or addressing income inequality?

Good economic policy will help both companies grow and invest in America, and improve wages and living standards for all Americans. A smart trade policy, a competitive tax policy, and a national-interest immigration policy, will all boost the quality of life for Americans and make the country stronger and more prosperous.

Q: Please explain why you support or oppose using more U.S. military power to resolve the situation in the Middle East.

The Middle East really presents three sets of issues. The Muslim Brotherhood is making great headway in the African littoral, we have the issues with Syria and Iraq and we have the challenges offered by Iran. Each of these requires different solution sets. Military power should only be used to achieve our national interests, and until such time as we have a better economy, we are limited.

Q: What measures do you support to protect Americans from domestic acts of terrorism? In a Trump administration, we will keep Americans safe while safeguarding their Constitutional rights. This would mean that I would insist that all federal agencies cooperate with state and local law enforcement to ensure that we have the broadest network possible working on collecting, and acting upon, intelligence that will suppress any attempts at domestic terrorism.

Q: Please explain why you do or do not think it is important to reduce the role of money in American elections.

Politicians have become puppets for their donors. I am the only candidate who is self-funding. The best way for voters to rebel against the influence of money in politics is with their votes: a Trump Presidency will return this government to the people.

Q: How do you propose to address the most important challenges facing our country? I have laid out four fights to face our greatest challenges: we must create an economy that raises pay and creates good jobs, ensuring those at the top pay their fair share. We have to support families by expanding access to health care and other vital services. We must maintain our leadership for global peace and security. Finally, we must stop the flow of secret money that corrupts our politics.

Q: In building a vibrant U.S. economy, would you emphasize helping companies expand and earn more or addressing income inequality?

The deck is stacked against ordinary Americans. That is why I have laid out plans to raise the minimum wage and to close unfair tax loopholes that benefit companies that shift jobs overseas. I will make investments that create jobs, including in infrastructure, research, and education. I'll fight for equal pay, paid leave, and lower taxes for working Americans—asking those at the top to pay more.

Q: Please explain why you support or oppose using more U.S. military power to resolve the situation in the Middle East.

Like President Obama, I do not believe we should again have U.S. troops in combat in the Middle East. If we have learned anything from 15 years of war, it is that we cannot substitute for local forces in missions to secure their own communities. Our strategy must be comprehensive—embedding our mission against ISIS within a broader fight against radical jihadism that is bigger than any one group.

Q: What measures do you support to protect Americans from domestic acts of terrorism? We have to shut down ISIS recruitment in the U.S. and stop foreign terrorists from coming here. We must disrupt plots before they are carried out by ensuring local law enforcement works with national counterterrorism experts. We must build on our

successes in securing loose nuclear materials and other WMD. And we need to empower American Muslims, who are key to the fight against radicalization.

Q: Please explain why you do or do not think it is important to reduce the role of money in American elections.

Campaign finance reform is needed to restore a government of, by, and for the people—not just the wealthy and well-connected. On issues from climate change to equal pay, Washington won't work for us unless we address the outsized role of money in politics. As president, I will appoint Supreme Court justices who value our right to vote—and I will work to end secret, unaccountable money in politics.

Q: How do you propose to address the most important challenges facing our country? While our intelligence and law enforcement agencies must have the tools they need to protect the American people, there must be legal oversight and they must go about their work in a way that does not sacrifice our basic freedoms.

Q: Please explain why you do or do not think it is important to reduce the role of money in American elections.

There is no issue more important than reforming our broken campaign finance system, which is increasingly controlled by billionaires and special interests. We must give Congress and the states the power to regulate money in elections, and we must require full disclosure of all campaign contributions. Ultimately, we should move toward public funding of federal elections.

Duties: U.S. Senators share the responsibility with Representatives for enactment of the nation's laws as provided for in the U.S. Constitution. They may also conduct investigations on issues of national importance. The Senate is charged with ratifying treaties established by the President and confirms Presidential appointments.

How Elected: The Senate consists of 100 members, two from each state. Senators are elected by a state at large and serve for six years. One-third of the Senate is up for election every two years. A Senator must be at least 30 years of age and must have been a citizen of the United States for at least nine years. In 2016, Maryland voters will elect one Senator.

Term: Six years

Base Salary: \$174,000

- 1. QUALIFICATIONS: How does your experience prepare you for the duties of a Senator?
- 2. ECONOMY: What economic policies would you support to assist low and middle income citizens?
- 3. FOREIGN POLICY: What are the most important foreign policy issues and how would you address them?
- 4. IMMIGRATION: What changes, if any, would you support in immigration policy?
- 5. ENVIRONMENT: What is the most pressing environmental problem and what measures would you support to address it?
- 6. INEQUALITY: What policies would you support to address increasing concern about economic, racial, and social inequality?
- 7. TAX REFORM: What changes, if any, would you support in federal tax policy?
- 8. OTHER PRIORITIES: What other issues are priorities for you?

Representatives must be at least 25 years old, have been citizens of the United States for at least 7 years and be residents of the state they want to represent.

Party Convention Delegates

Duties: Convention delegates elected in the primary are the people who officially elect their party's Presidential candidate at the national conventions. Presidential nominees are not elected directly by the voters in the primary. Rather, voters in each state choose delegates to represent them at the national conventions.

How Elected (Republican Primary): The Republican ballot lists candidates for delegates to the Republican National Convention and the Presidential candidate each one supports. Republican voters in each Maryland congressional district will elect 3 delegates and 3 alternates. The Spring 2016 State Republican Convention will select 11 at-large delegates. Those delegates will go to the Republican National Convention, which will be held July 18 – July 21, 2016 in Cleveland, Ohio.

How Elected (Democratic Primary): The Democratic ballot lists candidates for delegates to the Democratic National Convention and the Presidential candidate each one supports. Maryland will send 126 delegates to the Democratic National Convention in Philadelphia, PA, July 26 – July 28, 2016. Democratic voters in the Congressional districts will elect 64 delegates. Party rules determine the number of delegates to be elected from each district. The remaining 62 are chosen by the Maryland Democratic Party and consist of 31 appointed party leaders, 23 elected officials, and 8 alternate delegates. Questions for Convention Delegates:

QUALIFICATIONS: What are your qualifications to serve as a convention delegate? ISSUES: Why have you decided to pledge your support to your candidate?

Anne Arundel County Circuit Court Judge

Duties: Judges preside in the Circuit Court, which is a trial court of general jurisdiction covering major civil cases and more serious criminal matters. Circuit Courts also may decide appeals from the District Court and certain administrative agencies.

How elected: The state is divided into 8 Judicial Circuits. The General Assembly determines the number of judges in each circuit and county. When there is a vacancy, the Governor appoints a qualified person to fill the office. Each newly appointed Circuit Court judge then must stand for office at the first election that occurs at least one year after the vacancy happened. One or more other qualified members of the bar may also run to fill the vacancy. All candidates run on both the Democratic and Republican primary ballots. The winners of each primary (equal to the number of seats to be filled) advance to the general election ballot, but without party designation.

Term: Fifteen years, no term limit. Mandatory retirement age of 70 years.

Salary: \$154,433.

[3] Judges should make monetary contributions to pro-bono organizations or organizations/churches serving the poor and needy. [4] Reduce costs
- 4. EQUALITY: [1] Assure more diversity on the bench [2] Assure yearly sensitivity training for judges [3] Assure judgments are consistent, regardless of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, etc. [4] Assure competent representation for the poor and less fortunate [5] Assure "Equality Before The Law" for everyone, no exceptions

We need to better communicate these opportunities to the public. Also, attorneys need to be encouraged to volunteer their services more often, either through mandatory requirements or greater awareness.
- 4. EQUALITY: Courts need to conduct greater training and education of the judiciary to heighten awareness and acceptance of societal and cultural differences. Prejudice or decision-making patterns

reflecting prejudice cannot be tolerated and must be met with immediate disciplinary action. The public needs to be aware of the reporting procedure for any improper judicial practices.
