Dear congress, dear members, dear fellow liberals,

I feel it was just yesterday I was writing my last SG report but here we are, it's been five months and it's time for the next one. Time truly flies when you're having fun! And I am. I want to thank you all for providing me with the opportunity to work with something I'm truly passionate about, it's not everyone who can say they genuinely enjoy their job but I certainly do.

In order to make my report more comprehensive I've divided it into three sections: Administration, Events and Policy & Outreach, reflecting the core areas of my work. I hope this gives you an overview of what it is I'm actually doing all day.

Administration

The day-to-day running of the office is probably the part that you, as members, have the least insight to. Paying bills, managing the bookkeeping, staying in touch with all of you, our partners and financers, finding and booking event venues, arranging travels and writing grant applications and reports is, however, what takes up most of the time of the secretariat. I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to my former administrative assistant Paulína Gono and the current one, Rick Brans, for their excellent and hard work in helping me keep the ship that is LYMEC floating - at times it feels like there simply are not enough hours in a day or days in a week but with the help of the assistant we manage even the worst storms.

Given that the organisation sets increasingly more ambitious goals for itself and continuously expands the scope of activities, however, means we will soon reach the limit of what a secretariat of one Secretary General and a continuously changing assistant are able to manage. My recommendation would therefore be for us to explore different possibilities of engaging a third person in the office without it having severe financial implications on LYMEC.

Events

Unlike the administrative part, the events are what you, as members, clearly see us doing. As you might have noticed the number of activities during a year have steadily increased for the past years, much due to the very beneficial project deal we have with the European Liberal Forum. Our aim is to cater to the needs of all our member organisations by providing a variety of different events of both more capacity building and policy shaping character, while still keeping to the guidelines set up by our own plan of action and the priorities of the different financiers.

Since the Spring Congress we have organised a (well overdue) book launch of the Defending Europe publication, a Political Hackathon on Youth Unemployment, the ALDE Summer Academy (namely in cooperation with YDE), the communications training "Getting the Liberal Message Out" and the yearly Young Leaders' Meeting. With the exception of the Summer Academy all of the mentioned events are part of our project deal with ELF, which means we can offer them without participation fees but it also requires a lot from the secretariat by means of reporting before, during and after the event.

Policy and outreach

Another part of the job of the Secretary General is the policy and outreach and networking. Besides keeping a continuous dialogue with our financers, I also keep in contact with other partners like other entities within the liberal family, Members of the European Parliament, other Party-Political Youth Organisations, and the European Youth Forum, as well as other stakeholders. I try to attend seminars, debates and roundtables by different organisers as much as my other obligations provides time for, in order to keep up good relations with partners but also to get new insights for our own policy work.

A central part of our outreach work is to welcome our own member organisation at the office when they're visiting Brussels, and I would encourage all of you to always contact the office if you're planning a study trip or other visit to Brussels. Not only are we always ready to give a presentation about LYMEC and what we do, but we are also happy to
