### Key Legislative Positions

<b>Discrimination</b>	1. Oppose the "Religious Freedom" bill that would have discriminated against people in same sex relationships in matters of business and employment
<b>Public Education</b>	2. Oppose budget coercion, that forced legislators to choose between minimal education funding requirements in exchange for bad policy Oppose the elimination of teacher due process Oppose the creation of voucher-like "scholarships" Oppose the elimination of teacher licensure
<b>Budget and Taxes</b>	3. Oppose the State Budgets (FY 2014-16) that cut services to meet low revenues
<b>Judicial</b>	4. Oppose budget coercion, that forced legislators to choose between minimal court funding requirements in exchange for bad policy Oppose shifting Court funding to rely on user fees Oppose unbalancing of government by taking powers from the Chief Justice 5. Oppose political appointment of judges to Court of Appeals in 2013
<b>Voting Rights</b>	6. Oppose restrictions to voter party affiliation changes
<b>Health Care</b>	7. Oppose the Health Care Compact 8. Oppose restrictions to Medicaid expansion
<b>Environment</b>	9. Oppose repeal of wind and alternative energy requirements for utilities (RPS)
<b>Safety</b>	10. Oppose open carry gun law and the loss of local gun regulations
