How did your Johnson County, Kansas legislators do in 2016?






 Fiscal Sanity	1. Oppose the 2012 tax experiment (HB 2117) 2. Oppose the 2015 budget bill that raised sales tax rather than rescind 2012 tax experiment (HB 2109)
 Public Education	3. Oppose the creation of voucher-like “scholarships” (HB 2506) 4. Oppose the removal of college and career ready academic standards (Common Core) (HB 2292)
 Judicial Independence	5. Oppose constitutional amendment to eliminate our merit selection process for Kansas Supreme Court Justices (HCR 5005)
 Church & State	6. Oppose “religious freedom” on campus, allowing state-funded discrimination (SB 175)
 Health Care	7. Oppose the state assuming control of Medicare (HB 2553)
 Gun Safety	8. Oppose concealed carry without a license, and college campus carry (SB 45)
